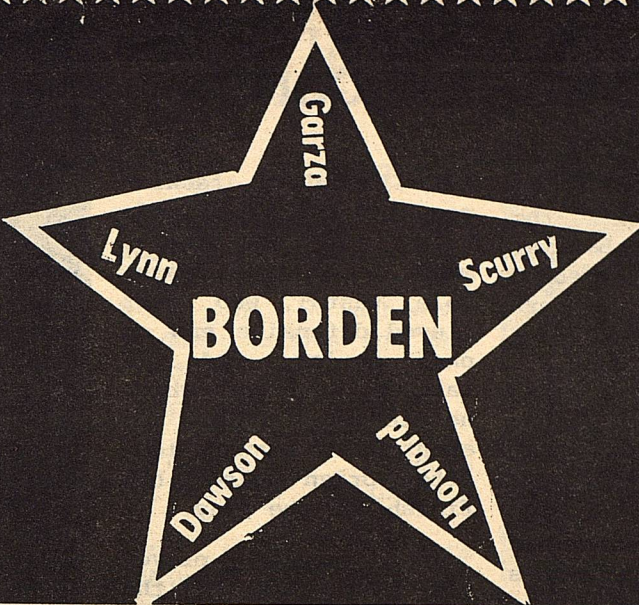

ABSENTEE VOTING

Absentee voting by personal appearance for the Nov. 8 elections begins Wednesday, October 19 at the county clerk's office in Gail.

A voter no longer needs to be out of the county on election day or older than 65 years of age to vote absentee by personal appearance.

Requests for absentee ballots by mail must be

received by the county clerk's office by November 1, Dorothy said. However, voters requesting ballots by mail must be 65 years of age or older, disabled, or absent from the county on election day.

COYOTES DEFEAT DRAGONS 20-16

The Borden County Coyotes traveled to Dawson and defeated the Dragons in a hard fought game. The Dragons quickly got to paydirt first as they took the opening kickoff and marched up the field. Their 52 yard scoring drive only took 4 plays and the Coyotes were down 8-0.

The Coyotes didn't score on their first possession, but their defense began to take control. Dawson only made 6 more first downs after their opening drive. They only gained 146 more total yards for the game.

In the third quarter, Jimmy Rios scored to put the Coyotes in the lead with a 10 yard run.

It looked as if the Coyote's defense was going to hold the Dragons on their next possession, but they quickly ran 36 yards for the go ahead points. Their score brought the score to 16-12.

The Coyote defense was to allow the Dragons 24 more yards on 10 plays.

With 8:58 in the fourth quarter the Coyotes' Lance Latimer scored his second touchdown on a 9 yard run to put the Coyotes in the lead for good.

After holding the Dragons, the Coyotes took the ball on their own 25 yard line and marched for what looked like an insurance touchdown. The Coyotes failed to score on a 4th and goal from the 1 yard line, but the next play was a big one as the Coyotes tackled the Dragons running back for a safety. The back took the pitch about 3 yards deep into his endzone and tried to sweep around his right end. He tried to reverse his field and Brian Bond was there to wrap him up, but before he went down the ball popped up and into another Dragon's hands. Paul Sturdivant and Chris Kilmer completed the safety for the Coyotes as they put the Dragon down in his endzone.

After the Dragon's free kick the Coyotes only had to run the remaining 1:52 of the game.

Jimmy Rios led all Coyote tacklers with 12 assisted and 6 unassisted tackles. He also caused a fumble. Lance Latimer made 10 assisted 6 unassisted tackles, and made a big hit to break up a pass completion in a critical situation. Lance Telchik played a big role in stopping up the middle with 13 assisted tackles as nose guard. Defensive ends Brian Bond and Paul Studivant

has 11 and 10 tackles respectively. Chris Kilmer and Shane Kemper made 4 tackles each. Cole Vestal who just played defensive end on one series made 2 tackles, one of which he stopped the back for about a 5 yard loss after Brian helped him finish off the play.

The defense played its best game of the year as they only gave up 125 yards rushing and 63 yards passing. The Coyotes tackled the Dragons 9 times behind their line of scrimmage for 42 yards to the negative. We didn't gain any turnovers, but there sure was a lot of good hitting.

Lance Latimer was the Coyotes leading rusher with 85 yards on 17 carries and 2 touchdowns. Chris Kilmer rushed for 51 yards of 8 carries. Jimmy Rios rushed 5 times for 30 yards and 1 touchdown. Patrick Herridge saw his first action of the year with 3 carries for 9 yards, 3 of which was on a critical 4th down and 1 yard needed for a 1st down.

Shane Kemper came through with 2 big catches for 53 yards. Jimmy Rios caught 1 pass for 29 yards. Lance Latimer caught a pass for 7 yards. Cole Vestal caught a pass for 6 yards. Brian Bond completed 5 out of 9 passes for 95 yards.

The Coyotes will meet Grady next on Friday, October 28, 1988, at 7:30 p.m. for the Borden Homecoming.

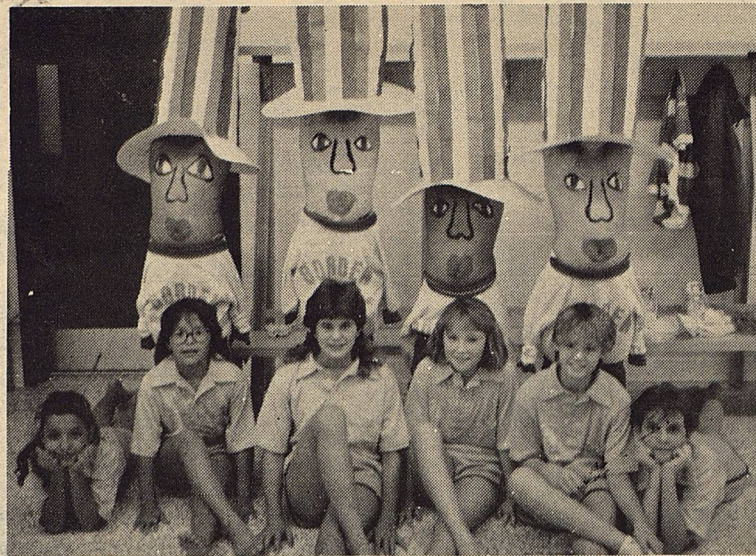
HOMEcoming STEW SUPPER

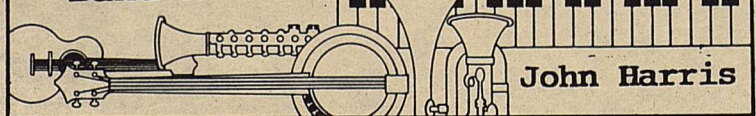

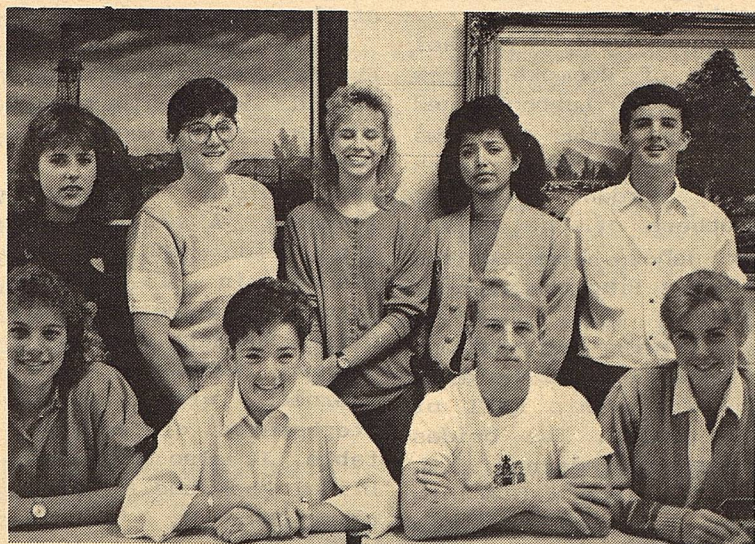
BAND MAKES EXCELLENT RATING AT U.I.L CONTEST

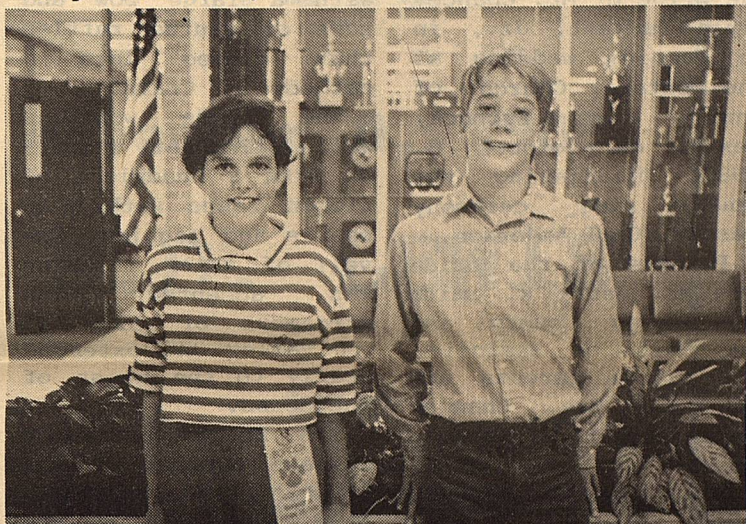

Tell you that on March 15, 1988, he awarded \$18,000.00 in equipment to one of the parties in a divorce suit, when the equipment did not belong to either party.

...and explain that he attempted to correct it by ordering the husband to pay his wife \$18,000.00 in cash because he could not award the equipment to her. See: Cause No. 15,865 132nd District Clerk's Office, Scurry County, Texas, 573-5371.

Tell you that for the 3 years and 9 months that he has been in office, he has had a regular practice of mailing congratulatory letters to various individuals in Scurry and Borden Counties.

...and explain the letters were typed at his direction by the court coordinator on the county's typewriter, during office hours, using the District Judge's stationery and postage all at tax-payer's expense!

CRP ANNUAL RENTAL PAYMENTS

We are in the process of making annual rental payments for 1986, 1987, and 1988 Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) contracts. Payments this year will be in check rather than a commodity certificate.

1988 DISASTER PROGRAM

Producers with crop losses greater than 65% or more will be required to purchase multi-peril or FCIC insurance for that crop for the 1989 crop year before any disaster payment can be made.

The deadline to purchase small grains and winter wheat insurance has been extended until October 31, 1988. This means if your 1988 wheat for grain was disaster affected you may need to move quickly

Disaster application for crop losses must be filed no later than March 31, 1989. For acreage harvested, production records will be required, and appraisals will be required on unharvested, acreage before evidence of the crop is destroyed. Disaster benefits apply to producers suffering a loss of production of

35% or more due to drought, hail or excessive moisture. This includes insect infestation or plant disease resulting from these perils. The disaster must have occurred within the 1988 calendar year. However, this does not include damage to crops that will be harvested in 1989 (wheat and other small grains being planted at this time).

WOOL, MOHAIR, AND UNSHORN LAMBS

Information required to determine eligibility for incentive payment under the wool and Mohair program include:

The original sales receipts with certification signed by the purchaser

The number of head shorn

The year and month shorn

Any purchases of unshorn lambs

Receipts for and freight paid for hauling

Receipts need to be brought by this office by January 31, 1989.

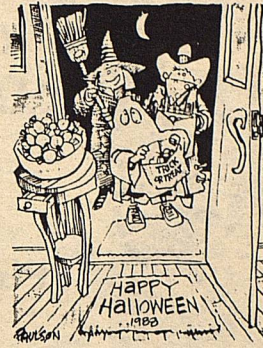
1988 COMMITTEE ELECTION

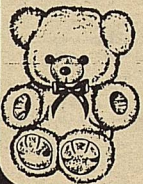
