A large crowd of participants, parents, grandparents and friends were on hand to view the annual Borden County Junior Livestock Show in which 94 lambs, 158 barrows and 24 steers were entered. By late Thursday evening the animals and their exhibitors had been trimmed, scrubbed and fluff-dried until they were all ready to enter the ring and be presented to the judges.

Although the animals are the ones to be poked and pulled, the kids and all of the hard work they put in on these lambs, barrows and steers is mainly what the Junior Livestock Association focuses on. Their neat appearance, their ability to handle the animals and the know-

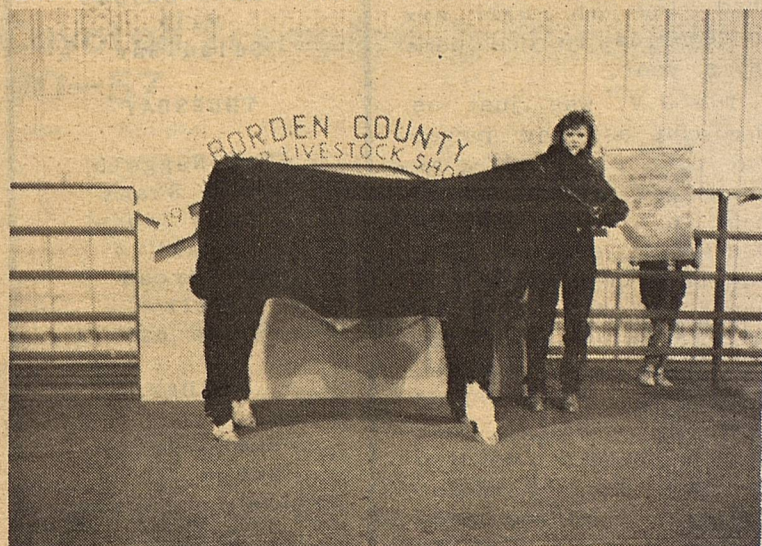

After much deliberation Mr. Jones chose a heavy weight Medium Wool as Grand Champion. For the Reserve Grand cont. to pg. 4

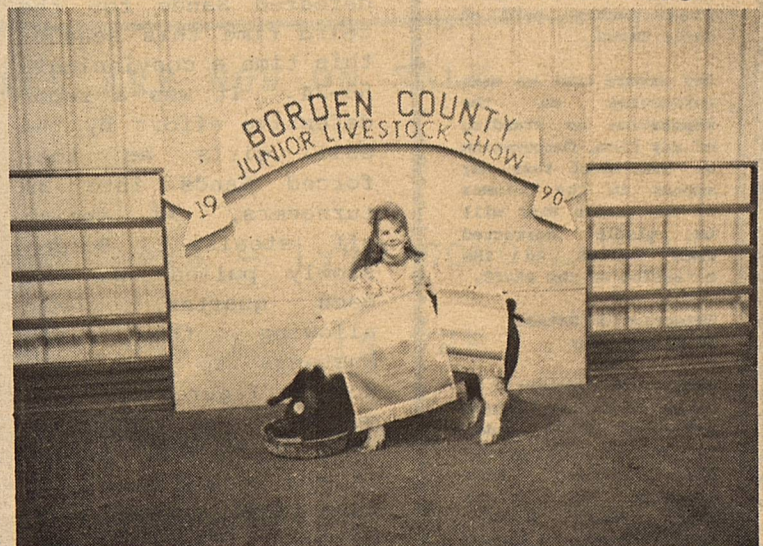


GRAND CHAMPION of SHOW STEER

Lady Coyotes K.O. Klondike

Borden County wrapped up the first half of district play here Tuesday night in style as they hammered the Klondike Lady Cougars by a score of 60-35. Borden led all the way, after a brief lead by Klondike at the beginning of the game. Klondike jumped out to a 5-4 lead before the Lady Coyotes scored 16 unanswered points. Leading 20-7 at the end of the first period of play, Borden had their lead cut by two 32-21 at half-time. Outscoring the Lady Cougars by three in the third stanza where they held a 17-6 scoring advantage. Leading scorer for Borden was Lisha Sternadel with 16 points followed by Amanda Anderson with 11. Randi Woodward hit 9 points, Kristi Adcock made 8, Leslie Fryar hit two three pointers for 6 points, Amy Lewis and Shara Dee Woodward each canned 4. Julie Harris, making her first comeback after knee surgery, made 2. Kristi and Julie each hit 100% from the field to lead in that category, with Kristi making 4 of 4 and Julie hitting her only attempt. Amanda

followed with 71% and Leslie hit 67%. Lisha led in free throw percentage with 100%, making 2 of 2. Randi, Amanda, and Shara Dee each had 4 steals followed by Kristi with 3. Amanda led in rebounds with 9 followed by Lisha with 7 and Randi with 5. Amanda had an outstanding assists total with 11 followed by Rachel Romero with 3 and Lisha with 3.

The J.V. girls, after a slow start, came roaring back to take a 51-27 win over Klondike. Borden jumped out to a quick 15-6 first quarter lead, but let Klondike close the gap to seven by half-time, 21-14. Then in the last two quarters, the Gail girls outscored Klondike 30-13 for their 8th win of the season against 2 losses. Shayne Hess led in scoring with 20 points followed by Kristin Kilmer with 14 and Kristin Monger with 10. Kelly Jo Ogden hit 5 points and Jacquelyn McPhaul made 2. Also playing was Heather Armstrong.

Lady Coyotes Defense Smothers Sands

In one of their best defensive efforts of the season, the Borden County Lady Coyotes defeated Sands for the third time this season, this time a convincingly 53-24. It was a super defensive effort by the Gail girls as they forced Sands into 39 turnovers, 30 coming off steals. Borden slowly pulled away in each quarter, never allowing the Lady Mustangs to get into double figures in any quarter and allowing them just nine points in the second half. A 15-8 first quarter lead became a 13 point lead at half, 28-15. Borden then outscored Sands 12-4 in the third

quarter and 13-5 in the fourth for the 29 point win.

Lisha Sternadel led in scoring with 23 points followed by Amanda Anderson with 8, Shara Dee Woodward made 7, Amy Lewis hit 6, and Kristi Adcock, Rachel Romero and Randi Woodward each made 3 for the total. Lisha, Rachel and Shara Dee tied for top honors in field goal percentage as each hit 50%. Lisha led in free throw percentage with 64%. Lisha also led in steals with an excellent total of 10. She was followed by Amy with 5. Lisha also led in rebounds with 10 followed by Kristi and Randi

with 5 each. Finally, Lisha led in assists with 4. This was the first time one player had led in all six categories in one game this year.

The J.V. was just as dominant as they jumped out to a 25-4 half-time lead and never looked back in a 45-19 win. A 9-2 first quarter gave the Lady Coyotes a lead start in what would be a 21 point lead by intermission. Borden held a 40-12 lead entering the last stanza before holding on for the 26 point victory. Shayne Hess led in scoring with 16 points followed by

Coyotes Blasted By Sands 67-37

The Sands Mustangs visited the Coyote gym last Friday and their aggressive defense and hot shooting smothered the Coyotes. The Coyotes shot the ball 45 times for the game and only made 15 for a 33 percent field goal average. 26 turnovers also prevented the Coyotes from scoring.

The Coyotes opened the game with 10 points in the first quarter and was within 3 points of the Mustangs. In the second quarter the Mustangs defense began to shut down the Coyotes and open opportunities for quick baskets. The Coyotes fell behind another 8 points as a result of the Mustangs 15 points. In the third quarter, the Mustangs continued their scoring output (19 points) and again held the Coyotes to 8 points. In the fourth quarter, the Coyotes handled the pressure defense a little better but the Mustangs offense rolled up 20 points to the Coyotes' 11 points. The hot shooting Mustangs made seven 3 point baskets and 14 out of 20 free throws, while the Coyotes did not make a 3 point basket and made 7 out of 14 from the foul line.

Cole Vestal led Coyote scorers with 18 points on 8 field goals and 2 free throws. He also had 2 offensive and 4 defensive rebounds. Jimmy Rios scored 6 points on 3 field goals and had 3 steals, 1 offensive and 6 defensive rebounds and one assist. Shane Kemper also scored 6 points on 2 field goals and 2 free throws. He also had 3 steals, 4 offensive rebounds and one defensive rebound. Cody Stone scored 4 points on 2 field goals and he had 1 steal, 1 offensive and 1 defensive rebound and one assist. John Paul Harris scored 2 points on a pair of free throws and had 1 steal, 1 offensive rebound and 3 defensive rebounds. David Buchanan scored 1 point and had a steal and 1 defensive rebound. Borden had so many chances to win Monday's game, but then so did Dawson. Dawson ended up with the last break and came away with the 29-27 overtime win. It was not without a great performance by Melody Harrison who racked up 26 of Borden's 27 points.

Dawson led at the end of the first quarter by a score of 6-4 and extended their lead to 15-8 with a 9-4 second quarter advantage. The Coyotes then came out ready to play in the third quarter as they outgunned the Dragons 10-2 in the third stanza. Leading by one at the end of the third quarter 18-17, Borden saw its lead slip away and tied, sending the

game into overtime. Both teams had leads in the extra period but Dawson edged Borden with three free throws in the final seconds for the close win.

Melody hit 10 field goals, one coming from the three point line and connected on 5 of 8 free throws for her season high of 26 points. Jana Kincheloe added the other point on a free throw. Borden's record now stands at 6-5 on the season and 5-4 in district play. The Coyotes wrap up the Jr. High season next Monday night at Klondike against the undefeated Cougars. Game time will be 6:00 p.m.

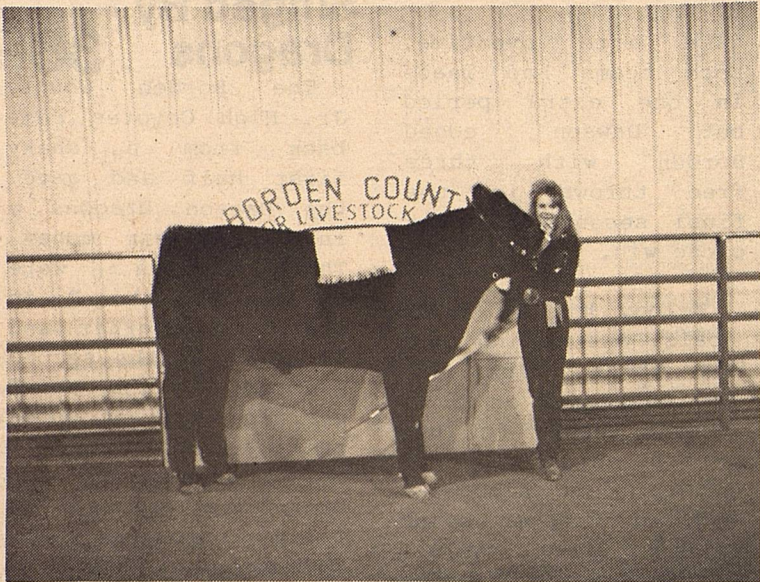
Coyotes Trampled By Mustangs 20-57

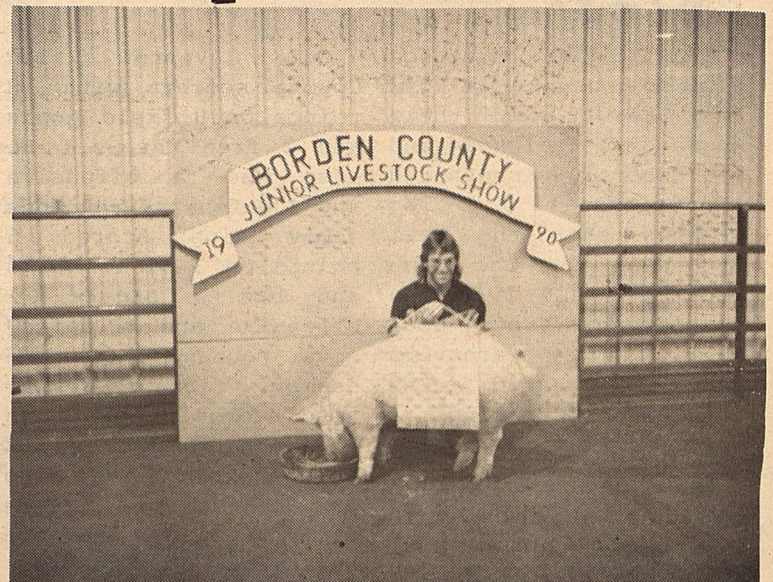

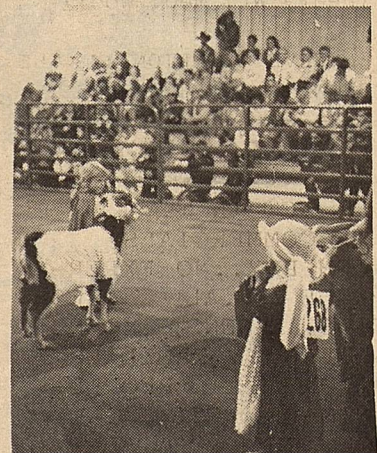
