Brackettville's Lions Club in affiliation with Sweetwater Jaycees will have their First Annual Rattlesnake Round-Up. The world's most unusual sporting event will get underway at 7:00 p.m., May 13th, with pre-briefing from the hunters at the Brackettville High School Auditorium. In conjunction with the Rattlesnake Round-Up will be a large gun-coin and collectables show and Flea Market. Happy Shahan, owner of Shahan Angus Ranch, Home of the Alamo Village will have RCA's newest Country Western Female Star, DOTTSY, to help open the festivities.

Kinney County Civic Center will open each day at 10:00 a.m., May 14, 15 & 16th, for hunters registration weigh-ins and purchases of snakes. There will be handling demonstrations of live domestic snakes. The Civic Center will remain open all day and the public is invited to buy, sell, trade, display or just look at the Gun-Coin and Collectables Show and Flea Market.

Registered hunters will be going in controlled groups to near-by Kinney County area ranches in search of their snakes. Individual ranch foremans, FFA, and 4-H members will assist the professional snake hunting guides on each ranch.

Awarding of prizes and trophies for best hunt will be awarded, 7:p.m. Sunday, May 16th.

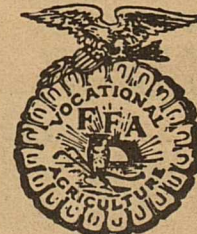
The little girls will be judged in bathing suits and the little boys in sportswear.

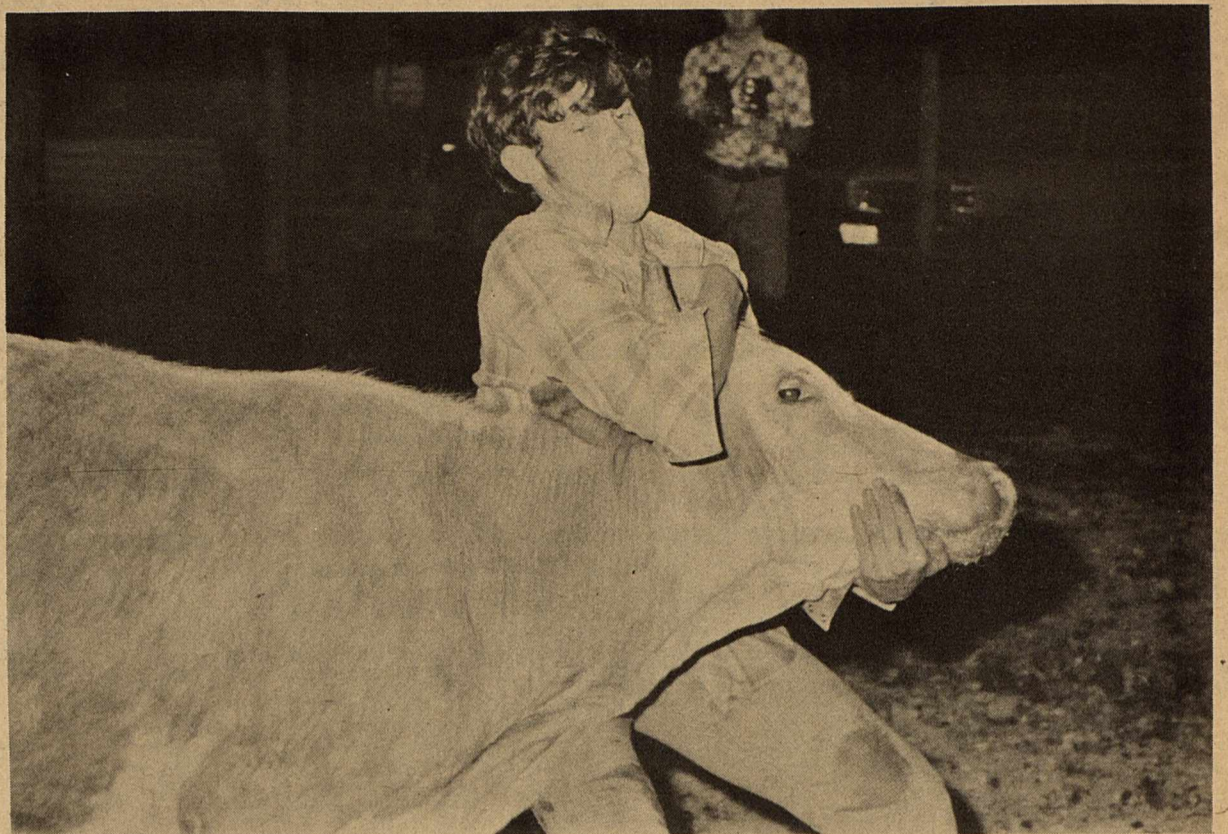

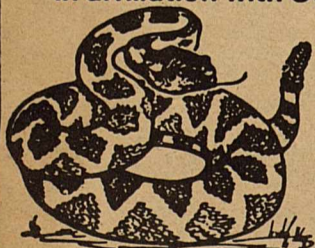

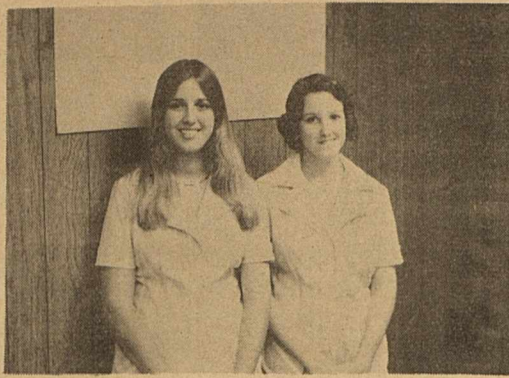

As I drove from San Antonio the other day I noticed a cow near the right of way fence. As I came nearer I saw she had her head through the fence eating. There was a bush about shoulder high to the cow and she was eating it. The peculiar thing about it was that the cow was standing between two bushes identical to the one she was eating. They were in fact against both sides of the cow. I think I never went fishing in a creek or river but that the other side always looks best. I read this week of a man who is making a big hit saying simple elementary things. He was saying "Black is dutiful". He was saying that moral and spiritual values are the most important. He was saying to young people "It's time to stop getting drunk, getting high and getting pregnant. Boys should stop studying Superfly and start studying Shakespeare. Girls should concentrate on their books instead of their bosoms." He was saying "The death of ethics is the sabotage of excellence." And he was black--a militant black--speaking to black school students. He could have been white, speaking to whites, or brown speaking to browns. What is right and good and important does not vary with the race. One young lady, an 18-year-old high school student, a senior, said, "Your father will sit down for an hour and a half and tell you the same things but when Jackson said it, it seemed different." It's so easy for the racist to put the monkey on some one elses back--simpler than take responsibility for himself and doing his own thing for right and progress. It's the same as the cow sticking her head through the fence, we can't see the forest for the trees. Some place else is better. Someone else has it better. It would be simpler and easier for the cow to eat in her own yard, take full advantage of what she has rather than look across the fence.

COMMENTS from THE SAGEBRUSH

This had been and still is ideal growing wether. The moisture, the absence of drying winds, the warm temperture, all combine to make things really jump. But as with most good times there are some contiugencies. One is that it is ideal for insects of many types. Many night feeding insects leave holes in the leaves of your plants and you never see the bug. Many are so small you need a magnifying glass to see. whatever the insect the best treatment is immediate treatment. Chloradane dust reamins the best all around insecticide for most things outside. Just dust it on the plants. Don't do it heavily enough to waste it but do it thoroughly. A liquid spray does well also. Perhaps the best all purpose spray is diazanon. You'll not likely findit under

it's name but under a brand name. Spectracide is the most widely used brand in this are. Two things to remember about insecticides, one, never use them unless you need them and two, use them only and carefully as directed. Don'e feed the bugs. They'll only produce more bugs and spread to your neighbors as well as damage you in the future.

GARDEN OF PEACE DEDICATION

Naval officers who fought against one another in the Pacific in World War II will meet at the Admiral Nimitz Center in Fredericksburg on Founder's Day, May 8th to dedicate a Garden of Peace, a gift from Japan. Coming from Japan for the ceremony will be Admirals Zenshiro Hoshina and Nobuo Fukuchi. From Washington, D.C. will be Admiral Thomas Moorer and Arleigh ("31 Knot") Burke. The garden is a gift to the people of America from the people of Japan, built with money raised by popular subscription in that country.

Admiral Thomas J. Moorer was Chairman of the Joints Chiefs of Staff, the highest American military post, when then-President Lyndon Johnson asked him to lend a hand to the Nimitz Center in any way he could. Admiral Moorer wrote to his old friend retired Imperial Japanese Navy Admiral Hoshina and asked his help. The results was a committee formed in Japan by Admiral Hoshina which raised the money to build the garden. The admirals will meet in Fredericksburg to see and admire for the first time the result of their efforts.

Other naval officers who will be in attendance are Admiral Nobuo Fukuchi who was in Fredericksburg for the ground-breaking for the Garden of Peace on April 26, 1975, and one of the most active fund

raisers in Japan. He'll meet an old friend, one of the most colorful of modern U.S. Navy commanders, Admiral Arleigh Burke. Nicknamed "Thirty-one Knot Burke" because of his high speed at which he maneuvered destroyers under his command at the Battle of Empress Augusta Bay in the Solomon Islands during World War II, Admiral Burke, a great admirer of his old commander Fleet Admiral Nimitz, twice held the same post as Nimitz, Chief of Naval Operations.

Admiral Nimitz' staff gunnery officer Rear Admiral E.M. Eller will be coming back to Fredericksburg for the first time in a number of years. He was here for the initial dedication of the museum.

Speaking on behalf of the Chief of Naval Operations will be Rear Admiral Burton H. Sheperd, Chief of Naval Air Training, from Corpus Christi. Introductory remarks will be by Rear Admiral Dallas Jordan, Chairman of the Admiral Nimitz Museum Commission.

The Garden of Peace is the first major unit of the Admiral Nimitz Center to be dedicated. Nearing completion is the Nimitz Trail, a history walk using a collection of rare relics from Pacific battlefields and beaches to tell the story of that war. As Commander-in-Chief Pacific Admiral Chester Nimitz, a native of Fredericksburg commanded more ships, planes and men than all commanders in all previous wars combined. In the Nimitz Center master plan but not funded yet is the restoration of

the Nimitz Steamboat Hotel, famous hostelry, and the Hall of Admirals, where exhibits will compare the culture of early Fredericksburg and old Japan through the eyes of small boys who later became friends, Chester Nimitz and Heihachiro Togo, hero of the Russo-Japanese War. A major feature of the Garden of Peace is a replica of the study of Admiral Togo. Admiral Nimitz called himself a "disciple" of the older officer.

The public is invited to the colorful ceremonies which will begin at 2:00 p.m. beside the old Nimitz Hotel, according to Bouglass Hubbard Center Director.

COUNTY AGENT REPORTS

BAD SCREWWORM YEAR

This is starting out to be a bad year for screwworms in Texas. The warm winter left a large overwintering population of the livestock parasites in South Texas, and they are appearing now. Kinney County has had approximately twelve confirmed cases during the month of April reports Carl Esser, Kinney County Extension Agent. The conditions now are ideal, and the livestock industry will have to give the Screwworm Eradication Program as much support this year as it ever has, maybe more, if we aren't to have a disastrous year for screwworms.

Sterile flies are now being released by airplanes over the confirmed cases reported area. These areas that are marked by producers will be hotspotted with flies for four weeks. The procedure will

Sterile flies are now being released by airplanes over the confirmed cases reported area. These areas that are marked by producers will be hotspotted with flies for four weeks. The procedure for marking the reported area is the same as before. The producer should make a cross or "X" 30 feet long and approximately 4 or 5 feet wide using a sack of lime. This makes it possible for the pilot to locate the infested area quite easily. At this time there are no sterile flies for ground release distribution like there was last year. Producers last year in Kinney County cooperated real well with the screwworm program, however, everyone this year will need to again join together to help fight and eradicate the screwworm in the Southwest.

CONTROL PECAN DISEASES

Protecting pecan trees from a host of diseases requires a carefully-timed spray program, contends Carl Esser, county agent for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Pecan scab and sticky shuck are two serious diseases that can be treated with the fungicide Benomyl.

Pecan scab is a fungal disease which causes black lesions the size of match head to appear on pecan shucks. It causes heavy pecan losses and premature loss of leaves.

The most effective treatment for scab is to apply Benomyl when the foliage is approximately one-third grown. Repeat the treatment in two weeks and continue treating once

every two weeks and continue treating once every two weeks during periods of intermittent rainfall.

Sticky shuck causes heavy pecan losses in late July and early August but does not affect the foliage. Black lesions from one-half to one inch on pecan shucks characterize the disease.

Applying Benomyl in late summer or at the gegining of the water stage of nut development deals effectively with this disease.

One way to cut down the incidence of these diseases is to grow resistant pecan varieties such as Choctow, Cheyenne, Desirable, Mohawk and Sioux, says Esser. Susceptible varieties include Western, Burkett, Halbert, San Saba Improved, Mahan, Success, Wichita and Cherokee.

For susceptible varieties, controlling pecan disease effectively depends primarily on the timing of fungicide applications, notes Esser.

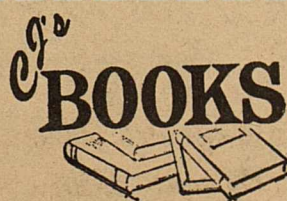

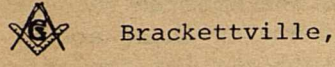
