FFA Leadership Teams End Year In Style

After a successful competition at District, several of the teams advanced to the Area competition and represented the Lone Wolf District in style. The Radio Team consisting of Nadia Baeza, Deann Parks, Christa Bass and Rebecca Grant (alternate) placed 4th and received a top 4 banner from a tough field of 17 teams. The Public Relations Team -- Haley Roe, Tera Stamper and Tammy Cooley performed their way into a 3rd place ranking as they competed with the top 7 teams in the area. The Jr. Skills team placed 1st out of 7 teams and earned the right to represent Area II in the State competition. This team consisted of Brande Wells, Fernando Baeza, and Cesar Mujica. Letty Lozano served as alternate. The Sr. Skills team did equally well as they also dominated their contest and placed 1st out of 9 teams. They also earned the right to represent Area II in the State Sr. Skills competition. Sr. Skills members Carrie Hart, Faith, Farmer and

Randi Farmer were plenty excited.

Both Skills teams went home polished painted, and practiced their skill and headed for the State Competition on Saturday, Dec. 9th. They had to travel for nine hours but finally arrived in Huntsville where they competed at Sam Houston State University. Each contest was made up of the top teams from each area in the state. This meant that there were only 10 teams in each event which included schools ranging from class 5-A to A. The Gail teams did remarkably well as the Jr. Skills team placed 2nd and the Sr. Skills team placed 3rd. Each team received a large top 3 banner and will

have their pictures published in the State FFA magazine as a top 3 finalist team. Gail FFA members competing in the state contest were: Brande Wells, Fernando Baeza, Cesar Mujica, Carrie Hart, Faith Farmer, and Randi Farmer. Letty Lozano also went as an alternate and did a great job assisting the students in their preparations.

Mr. Wallace stated that he is truly proud of all of the students and their success this year. He also stated that teams like the ones this year were the easy and fun ones to coach as their attitude and dedication took them a long way down the road of success.

Richard Buchanan, son of Bob and Terri Buchanan, has been selected to receive the Bert Dennis Scholarship award.

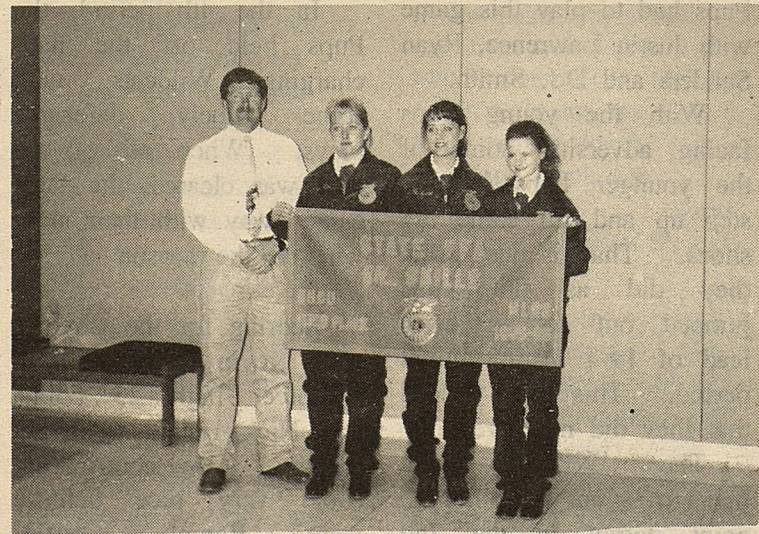

Richard, a 1994 graduate of Borden High



FSA Office Consolidation

OFFICE CONSOLIDATION

Effective October 1, 1995, the services of Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) were consolidated with the Farm Service Agency (FSA). This change will provide better service to the producers. For Borden County producers who are interested in farm loans or need information on farm loans, you will need to contact the Ag Credit Team of FSA at 109 NE 14th, Lamesa, Tx, or call (806)872-6761. At the preference of Rick Grogan, farm loan records will remain at the Lamesa location.

DIRECT DEPOSITS

Producers can now request direct deposit of your FSA farm program payments. This is a free service provided by FSA/CCC that allows producers to receive payments electronically deposited directly to their bank checking or savings account. This is a voluntarily elected option. For more information pertaining to direct deposit, please contact our office for assistance.

LIVESTOCK FEED PROGRAM

At the present time, Borden County is not in a livestock feed program. If pasture conditions warrant the implementation of an emergency feed program, producers will be notified by our office at that time.

SMALL GRAIN CERTIFICATION

Small grains must be certified by May 1, 1996.

COTTON LOANS

Cotton producers participating in the 1995 Acreage Reduction Program will have the opportunity to enter their cotton into a non recourse loan. The base rate for 1995 cotton in Borden County is \$0.5180 lb. Final date to enter 1995 cotton into loan is May 31, 1996.

CRP

Producers who baled their CRP are reminded that all bales of hay must be removed from CRP by December 31, 1995.

FOREIGN INVESTORS

Agriculture land that is bought or sold by foreign investors must be reported to the local FSA office within 90 days of the transaction. Failure to file in a timely manner could result in a substantial penalty.

1996 FARM OPERATION CHANGES

Producers with changes in their farming operations should contact the office. Changes include buying or selling a farm, renting a new farm, turning back a farm, breaking out new land or any change in contribution of capital, land, equipment, management, or labor.

When land ownership changes, a copy of the deed will be required. If a portion of a farm is sold, we will need a copy of the plat to establish farm boundaries. If a land owner passes away, a copy of the will is required.

When picking up a new farm, check to see if the previous tenant had been actively applying his/her conservation plan. If you operate a farm where the conservation plan has not been actively applied you will be ineligible for all USDA benefits on all farms you own and/or operate.

SPECIAL NOTICE 1995 DEFICIENCY PAYMENTS AND OVERPAYMENTS

Producers who received advance payments for 1995 upland cotton or grain sorghum should be aware that these payments may have to be refunded during 1996 because of the high market prices. Anyone wishing to refund the payment within the 1995 tax year should call the Borden County FSA office at (806) 756-4301 for more information.

ELECTRONIC WAREHOUSE RECEIPTS

Electronic cotton receipts (EWR's) are now permitted as an alternative to paper cotton warehouse receipts. Licensed cotton warehouse operators may now issue EWR's by electronically transmitting all necessary information to an approved provider. Approved providers operate an electronic computer system that electronically files and maintains cotton warehouse receipts in a central filing system. Currently, there are 3 approved providers who maintain EWR's for Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) loan LDP purposes. The approved providers are EWR Inc., and Plains Cotton Cooperative Association. A holder of an EWR is an individual or entity in possession, in fact, or by operation of law, of a receipt and by extension, of the cotton represented thereby. Once a provider has issued an EWR, the holder is in control of that EWR. The warehouse designates that the first holder and only that holder, or the holder's agent, can transfer EWR to new holder, including back to the warehouse. For CCC loan purposes, the current holder must be changed to CCC and the previous holder must be either the eligible producer or the producer's agent. For LDP purposes, the current holder of EWR must be 1 of the following:

- *CCC
- *eligible producer or producer's agent

If you want to designate an agent to act on your behalf, you must file and ASCS-211 with our office. EWR's eligible for CCC loan must include the producer's name and the farm number where the cotton is produced. If you request to release EWR's (CCC is the holder) from which you have received loan or LDP benefits, CCC will release the receipt according to the producer's or producer's agent's request. However, if CCC was made a holder and no loan or LDP benefits were received, EWR shall be released to the previous holder. If you have any questions on Electronic Warehouse Receipts please contact our office.
