# **DPS** urging holiday safety

AUSTIN - It may be the couple driving home from an office party or a college student shuttling themselves to another latenight bar, but the Department of Public Safety expects 42 people to die on Texas highways during the Christmas holidays.

"We all get caught up in the holiday rush," said DPS director Dudley Thomas. "It leads to speeding, people neglect to fasten seat belts."

The counting period runs for 102 hours, from 6 p.m. Dec. 24 to midnight, Dec. 28. There were only 18 deaths during the holiday last year, but that included just 30 hours.

DPS also predicts that up to 46 people could lose their lives during the New Year's holiday.

Having Christmas and New Year's fall near a weekend means that people will be celebrating longer, providing more opportunity for accidents, Thomas said.

DPS will have every available trooper on Texas roadways to encourage people tp drive safely and legally, Thomas added.

# Commissioners appoint County Clerk

Jan Pierce of Muleshoe has been appointed as the new County Clerk effective Jan. 1, 1998.

Bailey County Commissioner's Court made the appointment during a special session Friday after hearing statements from Pierce, Jana Leal and Sherri Harrision, who all expressed interest in the position.

Pierce and Harrison both have intentions to run for the County Clerk position in the primary election in March.

Pierce will replace County Clerk Billie Downing, who turned in her resignation earlier this month. The current term expires Dec. 31, 1998.

At the meeting, Pierce, who currently works for the Bailey County Sheriff's office, told the court that she wants to serve the public.

"I feel like I can do the job," said Pierce," It would be a pleasure for me to serve the people. I think it's important to run a good office and keep good records for the county and the people."

In other business Friday, the

commissioner's unanimously showed support for local EMS volunteers by deciding to increase the compensation for their services.

EMS volunteers will now be paid \$5 more by the county for each call, increasing in-town compensation to \$15, and out-of-town to \$20.

Although all of the Commissioners where in support of the increase, Precinct 2 Commissioner C.E. Grant and County Judge Marilyn Cox both heavily praised the volunteers for

The dance will be held from 7 p.m. to midnight. Los Rieleros Del Norte and Corazones Del Norte will be playing.


# Moonlight Madness drawing Dec. 22

# Reindeer: The real story

some people, reindeer do actually exist

However, to my knowledge, I have only heard of eight that can fly and one that has a red nose. The flying I cannot explain. The red nose may be a genetic mutation, the results of chronic respiratory problems or a alcoholic reindeer.

In reality, reindeer, Rangifer tarandus, are herbivores indigenous to tundra and taiga lands of the far north. In further classification of these animals, they are ungulates (animals having hoofs), and they are ruminates.

Ruminants are even-toed mammals that chew cud and have a complex chambered stomach. This type of digestive system allows for the digestion of food with a high cellulose content.

Reindeer, as the name implies, are members of the deer family. Reindeer are unique to the deer family in the both sexes, including calves, produce antlers. Reindeer are closely related to the caribou differing mainly in disposition and body size

In fact, caribou are called 'wild reindeer" in some parts of the world. Adult female reindeer (cows) weigh approximately 230 pounds and a typical make (bull) weighs about 300 pounds. As within any species of animals, wide variations in body weight can occur. Some reindeer bulls can reach or exceed 450 pounds just before breeding season in the early fall.

I mentioned that the tundra is the native land of the reindeer. The tundra is a flat, treeless area that extends across the Arctic lowlands in North

America, Europe and Asia. The tundra is mostly snow covered for about 10 months of the year. Most of the soil under the snow, except for a thin top layer about 2-4 inches deep, stays frozen all year.

This frozen soil is called permafrost. When the snow and ice melt in the summer, the water cannot seep into the permafrost so numerous lakes and pounds are formed.

Summer on the tundra lasts form mid-June to mid-August. During these two months colorful, flowering plants mix with moss, lichens and other vegetation. This provides the major food supply to reindeer herds and many other animal species.

Reindeer numbers in the United States are limited for all practical considerations to Alaska.

In Alaska, reindeer are classified as domestic livestock and are found in the western coastal areas and on some offshore islands.

Reindeer are not indigenous to Alaska. They were transported to Alaska from Siberia to be used by the local population. Dr. Sheldon Jackson, a Presbyterian minister and general agent for education in Alaska, made a voyage to Alaska in the summer of 1890 and found people in need of meat and hides.

Through his efforts and others, the first reindeer were transported fro Siberia to Alaska in 1891. From 1892 to 1902, the government imported some 1,280 reindeer in to Alaska from Siberia. In 1902, The Czarist government for bid any more exports of reindeer to Alaska. By 1901, 10 missions had been established in Alaska and many

were associated with the newly established reindeer herds that had increased to a total of 4,164 animals.

As part of the reindeer program, 67 Lapp, Finn and Norwegian families were brought to Alaska in 1898 to care for the herds and to serve as mail carriers and freighters.

Form 1902, the reindeer population in Alaska grew rapidly with some reported interbreeding with caribou. In these early years of the industry, owner ship of the reindeer was spread between Eskimos, Lapps, missionary societies, a and the Bureau of Education. Eskimo apprentices served a five-year term learning the methods of herding in use at the time.

They were given two female reindeer a year plus food and shelter. At the end of five years, the new herder was given enough additional reindeer to increase his to 50 head. The herder was under the supervision of his sponsor for an additional 20 years and could lose his herd at any time if he was found guilty of "intemperance of failure to care for his herd."

Rapid growth in numbers of reindeer continued with an estimated 47,266 animals being present by 1913 of which 65 percent belonged to native Eskimo herders.

These native owners had herds averaging less than 40 head each. By 1929, there were an estimated 400,00 reindeer in western Alaska. In 1930, approximately 500,000 pounds of reindeer meat was exported from Alaska.

From 1930 to 1937 was the period of greatest reindeer abundance. Peak numbers of 640,000 head stared to drastically decrease to an estimated

250,00 head in 1940 and further decreased to an estimated 25,000 head in 1950. This decrease was though to be the result of poor management, overstocked range, predation by bears and wolves, losses to

migrating caribou and disease. Current populations are estimated at 33,000.

# Four Longhorns on all-region team

Led by the pass-catching combination of junior quarterback Josh Morris and senior wide receiver Chris Smith, four Lazbuddie Longhorns were named to the first team of the All-Region I six-man football

Joining Morris and Smith were senior center Jason Thomas and senior defensive lineman Blas Martinez.

Lazbuddie defensive lineman Brice Redwine and Three Way linebacker Jonathan Kindle were named to the second team.

Silverton and Follett had three players each on the first team.

Morris passed for 2,370 yards and 32 touchdowns while helping the Longhorns (12-2) reached the state semifinals for





"Bob Smith's departure at the end of next year will allow us to have the time we anticipated to complete a successful partnership on behalf of agriculture," said Combest. "I am focused in the remaining year on enjoying my association with Bob and looking forward to working with the Republican leadership so farmers and ranchers will remain worldwide leaders in the production of a safe and reliable supply of food and fiber."

Combest incurred the wrath of Gingrich during the debate over the 1996 farm bill.

Disagreements over how to treat cotton in legislation designed to curtail federally guaranteed subsides to farmers led Combest and a handful of other Republicans to join with Democrats in blocking a bill by that committee.

At one point, Gingrich threatened to remove Combest from his position as chairman of the House Intelligence Committee in apprent retaliation.

Combest, who was raised on a farm in the Texas Panhandle, is currently the house Agriculture Committee's vice chairman.

# If He Really Came,

If He Is Really Coming . . .

I have no use for grinches who try to steal Christmas joy, and I don't wish to steal any of yours, but . . . .

It was last week, I think, when a shooting at a school in Paducah, Kentucky, made the headlines. That sort of thing is a tragedy at any time of year. Horrible. Senseless. Useless. And worse. But, sadly, we have grown accustomed to reports of such tragedy partly, I suppose, because they happen more often than they

Shelburne once did and partly because a downside to our modern age is that we "get to" hear about tragedies every day that occur a lot farther off than in

Kentucky. We almost have to become desensitized to the carnage. Until we hear a name. And a story. And we see the hurt is real.

I heard a name today, a name now inexorably, unfairly, permanently connected to that shooting, and the tragedy is a much more poignant reality to me now.

Missy Jenkins is a 15-year-old girl, an active member of the 32nd Street Church of Christ in Paducah, who didn't do anything to deserve what happened to her just a few weeks before Christmas 1997. But she was in the path of the bullets in Kentucky, and for the rest of her life she will be paralyzed because of a senseless moment when one hurting and hurtful

individual chose to spread his pain.

I have no idea what Missy wanted for Christmas, but it certainly didn't resemble what she has been "given." Nothing about the days ahead will be for her easy or quick. Lots of tears will be shed for lots of years. She and her parents and her friends will learn to deal with the pain that is now theirs. I am confident that Missy will still be able to live a life that is good, a life that can still be a wonderful blessing. But I assure you it will be a much different life than what she and her parents had envisioned. That Missy and those who love her have been forced to deal with such shattered dreams makes me sad. And angry. I hate the fact that this sort of thing happens in this fallen world. Like so many who have heard about this tragedy, I want to ask, "Dear God, why?" As a Christian, I want to ask, "Dear God, how long will you put up with this? How long must this world wait before you come to end this sort of suffering? Father, how long?"

No easy answer. But I believe with all of my heart that God hates what happened to Missy worse than I do, worse even than Missy and her parents do. Sorrow, pain, and despair would have us all were it not for Bethlehem. He came. He's coming. If Christmas is no more for us than lights and tinsel, then our hope is a transient thing that can be unplugged and packed away with the rest of the ornaments. But if He really came, if He is really coming, therein lies real
