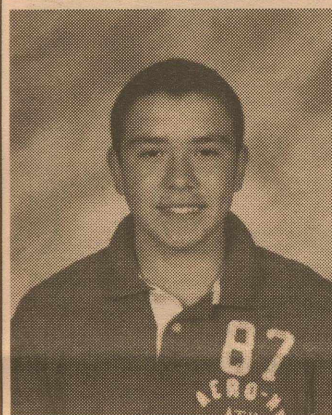

Just for today, help others and be considerate.

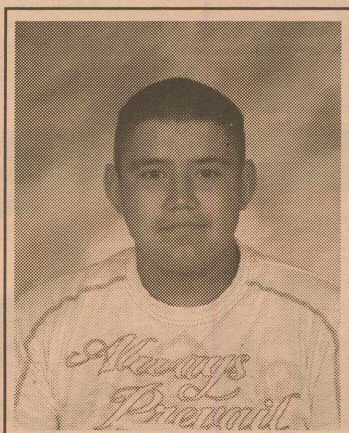

Hoard No More

Who doesn't want to clear clutter and save money at the same time? Well, professional organizer Monica Friel tells us how it's done.

It's as easy as carving out the time to focus on three main spaces—your closets, your garage and your basement or attic, says Friel, who runs her own Chicago-based organizational business called Chaos to Order.

De-clutter and donate. May is a great time to remove your heavy winter gear and replace it with lighter clothes for Spring and Summer. While you're planning this switcheroo, restock carefully.

Donating unwanted Winter or Spring items can save space and money come tax time. Just make sure you get a receipt for your records and know that some Salvation Army locations will schedule pickups for furniture or larger donations.

For the Winter clothes you intend to keep, consider storing and labeling them in the really large storage bags/totes or space saving bags to stay organized.

Don't forget the garage. Here's an overlooked space that plays a more important role than you may realize. "It's the first thing that opens," Friel points out. "It's kind of a window to what the rest of your home is like."

With that thought in mind, clear your garage of the clutter that gathers over the Winter. Put away shovels, salt and snow brushes. "The same change of season cleaning that we do to closets, we should do for the garage," Friel notes.

Again, donating items creates space, saves money and helps a good cause.

Go for the gusto. While you're in spring-cleaning mode, channel that momentum into tackling a bigger, sometimes daunting project such as the basement or attic.

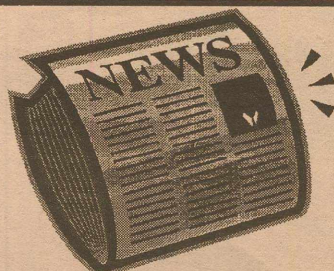
"Now is the time to dig into the tough projects," Friel said about the Spring months. Too

often, home owners will get overwhelmed by cluttered areas like basements and avoid them. "They say, 'Oh my goodness!' and turn around and walk upstairs," she said.

If you're guilty of this behavior, here are some tips to turn a dreaded chore into a fun task:

- Pump up the volume: Make a de-clutter playlist full of high-energy tunes.
- All together now: Enlist the family and do short bursts of cleanup, meaning each person picks up 20 things in the next 15 minutes.
- Create Rewards: After the task is finished, watch a favorite television show or movie. Or award prizes to the person who picks up the most.

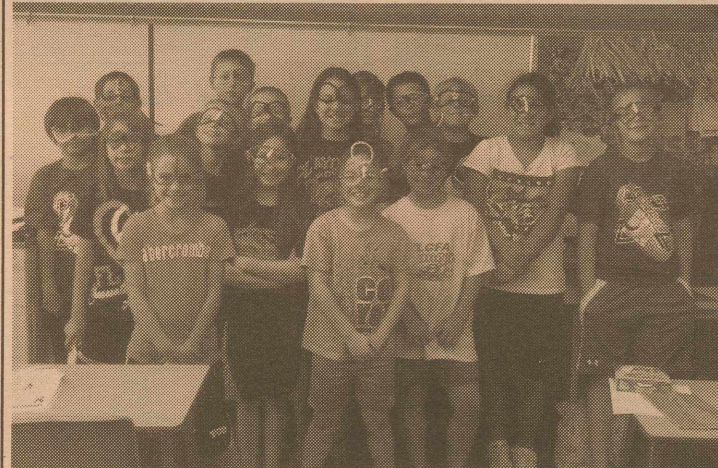

Be 'Respectacle'





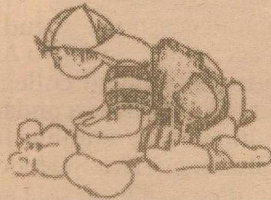

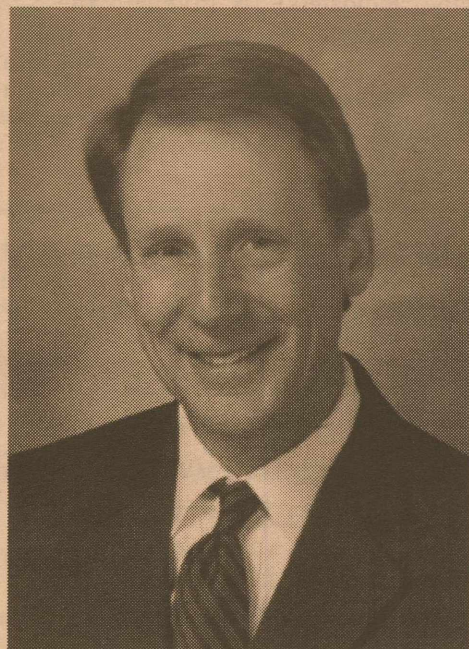
