FHA Financing Planned For Leon Residents Water Supply

A good rule of thumb for successful pasture planting is prepare a good seedbed, put down the correct amount of fertilizer, use good sprigs for Coastal Bermuda grass. Use and seed with a current analysis showing Pure Live Seed for other grasses. Plant each type of grass at the correct depth in a workman like manner. Follow up with mowing, shredding or chemicals for weed control. Graze properly after the grass is established, do not graze no more than 50 percent by volume weight to allow the new plants to establish a good root system and go into the winter with good vigor and edequate cover on the land.



R CARBON MANBENGE

What is causing my peach leaves to become red and swol-This is a question that is being asked by many people

This disease like many other plant diseases must be prevented before the symptoms

Peach leaf curl is a fungal distase which attacks the young developing leaves as they emerge from the bud scales. As a result of this infection growth hormones are produced, which induce the leaf to become puckered and distorted.

Ferbam is a fungicide that can be applied in the winter or spring at the pink bud stage for the prevention of this disease. It must be applied prior to the leaves emerging from the buds. Forbam should be used at the rate of 11/2 to 2 pounds per 100 gallons of water or 11/2 to 2 tablespoons allon. If your trees have disease, make a note to

Those who use it this year report good control

If you did not spray for peach leaf curl this year, you could pull off the infected leaves and burn them so that the rate of overwintering inoculum will be reduced.

Several meetings are being held in Eastland and surrounding counties to urge farmers to grow Guar. The use of guar products is expanding rapidly and buyers want to get farmers in this area to produce this crop.

This crop grows well on the same type of soils that are good for peanut production. A farmer could expect to make a net income of \$20 to \$40 per acre.
