nation-lost again fast week, when the Senate of the Unitec Stapes said that you do not have enough sense to know the type of government you prefer in your state government, and that
you do not have the right to organize your state government you do not have the right to organize your state government

would not dictate the type of government a state would havejust that the people of the state-and not a small group of men in Washington-would be the ones to decide on their own form of government.
