E IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Section 1. That Section 2. ritcle VIII, Constitution of

STATE OF TEXAS: Section 1. That Section 2. Article VIII, Constitution of the State of Texas, be amend-ed to read as follows: "Section 2. All occupation taxes shall be equal and uni-form upon the same blass of subjects within the limits of the authority levying the tax; but the legislature may, by general laws, exempt from taxation public purposes; all real and personal property owned by a nonprofit water supply corporation which is reason-ably necessary for, and is used in, operation of the corpora-tion in the acquisition, storage, transportation and sale of (of) religious worship, also any property owned by a church or by a strictly relig-ious society for the exclusive use as a dwelling place for the minitary of such church or re-ligious society, and which yield no revenue whatever to
