4. 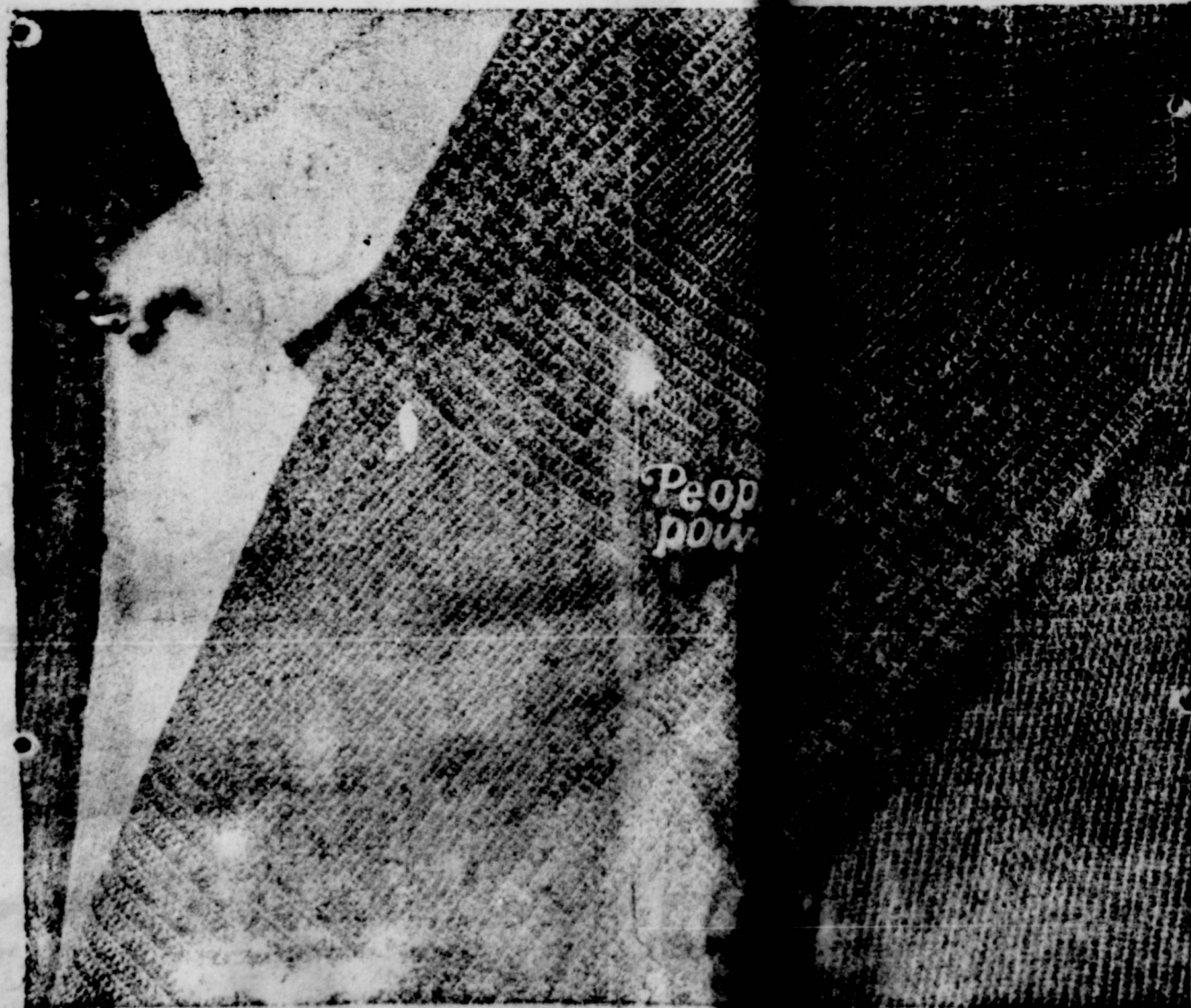
