County Livestock Show Superintendents Named

Superintendents of the various divisions of the annual Eastland County Livestock Show, March 12-14, have been named, according to Robert Kincaid, Morton Valley, General Show superintendent. Buck Wheat, Eastland, will assist Kincaid.

Willie Cantwell, Ranger, will head up the Angora Goat Division at the annual affair.

Weidon Tankersley, Morton Valley, will superintend the sheep classes except the fat lamb division which will be supervised by Jimmy Horn and Ed Lepley, Eastland, and Gaston Boyd, Cisco.

Ross Wilson, Gorman, and Joe Criswell, Rising Star, will supervise the classes of beef cattle except fat steers. Wilson, former President of the County Livestock Raisers Association, is presently serving as President of the Eastland County Hereford Breeders Association. He is also Manager of the Southwestern Peanut Growers Association. Ode Criswell, Rising Star farmer, breeds registered Angus Cattle.

C. E. Bridge, Superintendent of the Desdemona Public Schools will head up the dairy division while Ben McKinnis, Eastland, Rural Representative of the Texas Electric Service Company, will be in charge of the fat steer division.

Park Plambeck, Pleasant Hill farmer, and Jack Therwhanger, Eastland, patrolman for the State Department of Public Safety, who managed the swine division last year, will again serve in the same capacity.

All animals must be in their places by 10 p. m. on March 12th. The sale of fat pigs, lambs and steers will be on the night of March 14th.

Burleson Makes Perfect Record For Attendance

Washington, D.C. — A review of the record of the First Session of the 88th Congress that adjourned in December, shows Congressman Omar Burleson, 17th District of Texas, to be one of only 15 members of the House with a perfect attendance record on recorded votes. He was one of an even smaller group who did not miss a quorum call during the Session.

There were 119 recorded votes during the Session and Burleson was present and is on record with a "yea" or "nay" on each. There were 137 quorum calls, and he was present in every instance.

Of the 435 members of the House, the average voted on 84 per cent of the roll calls.

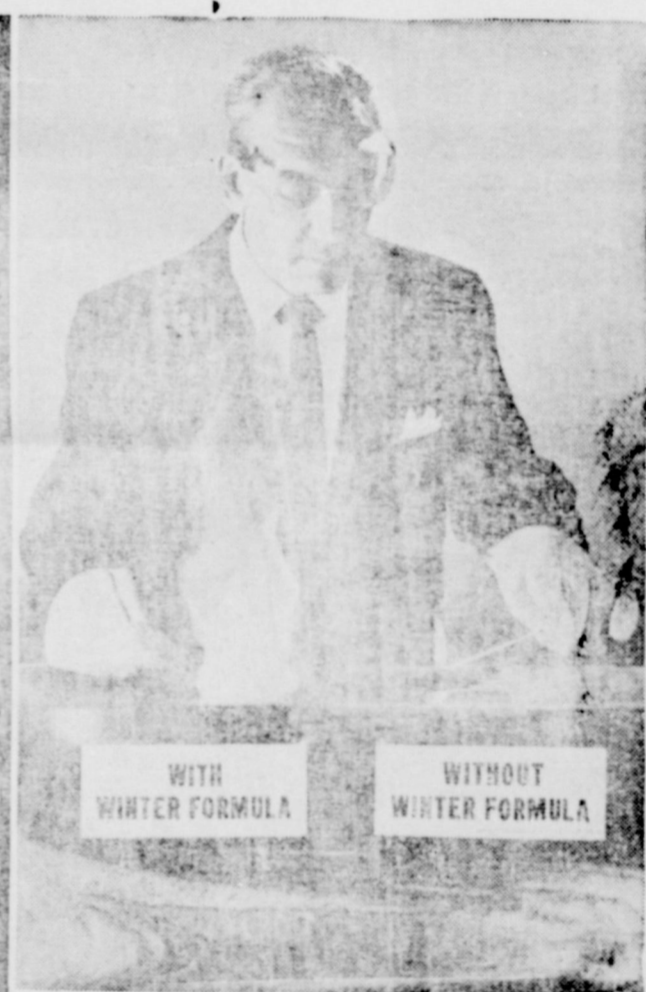
