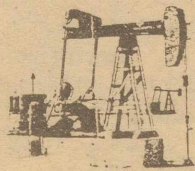

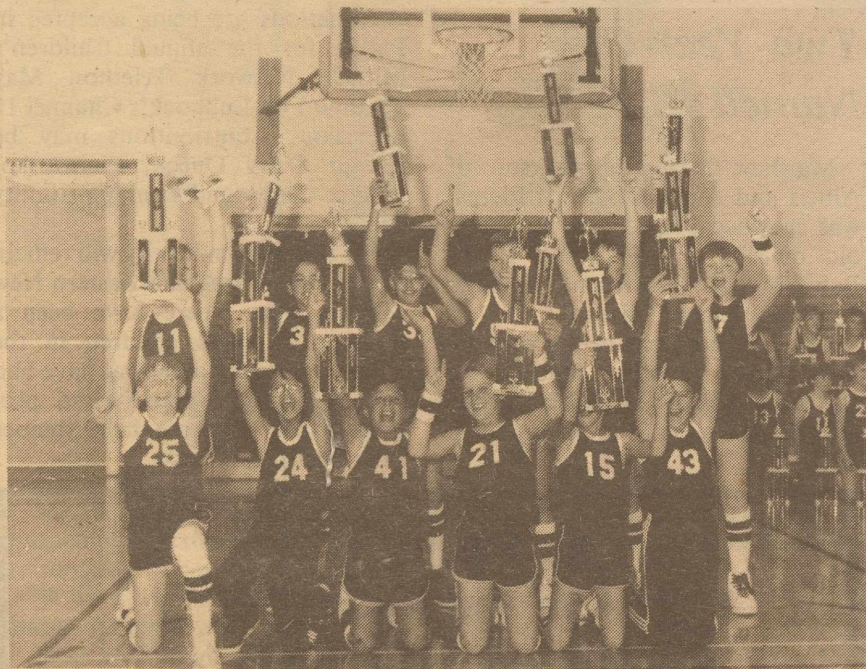

Plains Juniors and Majors claimed the championships of the Continental Division National Tournament held here last weekend. Tony Winn and Coy Lowrey are coaches of the Champion Juniors; Stan Ashburn and Brady Phillips, the Champion Majors.

Plains Juniors tromped Crowell 63-14 in their opening game. Scoring for Plains were Rains, 16; Green, 14; Bernal, 14; Winn, 7;

A native of Gruver, he holds a BA from Hardin-Simmons University and MA and PhD from Texas Tech. He has been associated with the Southwest Collection since 1971.

Dr. Murrah has served as president and treasurer of Lubbock Heritage Society, as a member of Lubbock 2005 Committee and as chairman of Lubbock Sesquicentennial Committee.

He and his wife, Ann, have four children.

Children will be fingerprinted, dental charts recorded and other identifying procedures made.

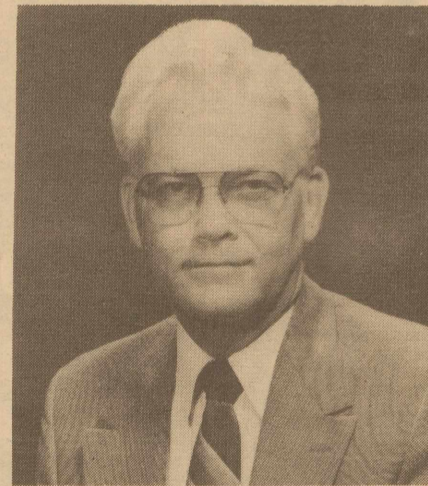
## Telethon Monies Being Accepted

# Trackmen Capture District, First Championship Since '68

Plains High School cindermen captured the district track championship last week in the Cowboys Class AA farewell. Plains will be competing in Class A beginning with the 1986-87 school year.

The Cowboys' championship was their first district title in 18 years. The district championship was last won by Plains in 1968.

Trailing by 70 points after the field events, the Cowboys raced to the title in running finals.

Earning berths into regional competition were 1600 meter relay runners Mike Diaz, Randy Kennedy, Roy Caballero and Billy Curtis with a first place district win. Their performance was clocked at 3:34.2.

Joe Rivera will be running the 3200 and 1600 meter runs at regional after winning both events in district competition. His times were 10:55.3 and 5:05.1, respectively. Roger Rivas finished second in the 1600 with 5:15.6 to also nail down a ticket to regional.

Caballero and Diaz will compete in regional 800 meter runs, also. They finished first and second with 2:09.1 and 2:09.8, respectively.

Curtis will also be competing in regional 110 hurdles and 300 hurdles, Martin Barrientes in 110 hurdles and Bryan Baldwin in 300 hurdles. Curtis won first in both events with Barrientes and Baldwin taking runner up spots.

In the 110, Curtis finished 14.7; Barrientes, 15.8 and Baldwin placed 4th with 16.1. In the 300, Curtis ran 42.5; Baldwin, 43.8 and Barrientes, 44.0.

## Little Dribblers



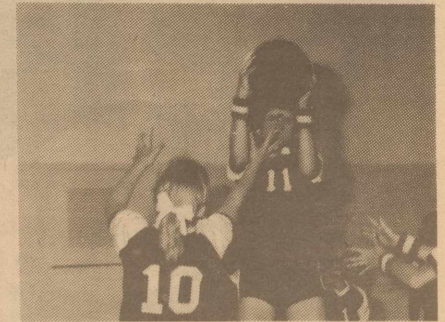



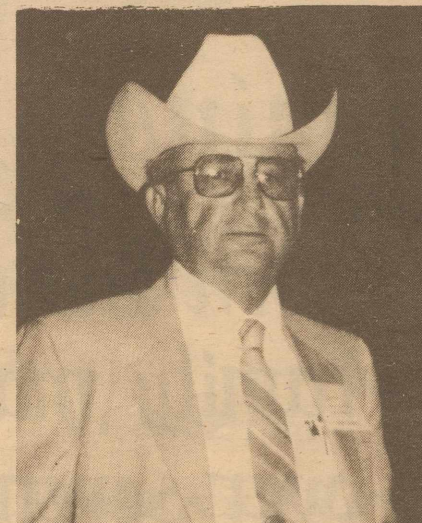

### BROCCOLI CASSEROLE

1 pkg chopped broccoli  
1 c cooked rice  
½ c chopped celery  
½ c chopped onion  
1 8 oz Jalapeno Cheese Whiz  
1 can cream of mushroom soup  
Cook broccoli, celery and onions until tender. Add rice, soup and cheese. Bake at 350° til it bubbles.

### CHERRY SALAD

1 can Cherry Pie filling  
1 lg container Cool Whip  
1 can Eagle Brand Milk  
1 medium can drained pineapple  
1 c nuts  
Mix all ingredients. Chill for 2 hours.

### CRISPY CHICKEN STIR FRY

1 c Bisquick baking mix  
½ t pepper  
2 c diced uncooked chicken breast  
2 eggs, slightly beaten  
¼ c vegetable oil

3 medium carrots, cut diagonally into ½ pieces  
1 green pepper, cut into strips  
1 sm onion, cut into thin slices and separated into rings  
1 can (20 oz) pineapple chunks, drained

Mix Bisquick and pepper in large plastic bag. Stir chicken into eggs; remove chicken with slotted spoon and place in bag with baking mix. Shake bag until chicken is coated; remove chicken from bag.

Heat 1 T of the oil in 10" skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Stir-fry carrots 2 min. add green pepper. Stir-fry carrots 2 min. Remove from skillet; keep warm. Add remaining oil to skillet; heat until hot.

Stir-fry chicken until golden brown; add carrots, green pepper and onion. Stir-fry until warm, about 2 mins.; stir-fry until warm, about 2 mins.; stir in pineapple. 6-8 servings.

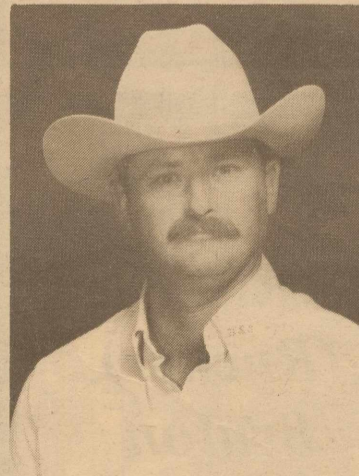

A Mickey Mouse theme was carried out in plates, cups and napkins. Balloons and party favors completed the birthday decor. Cupcakes and juice were served.

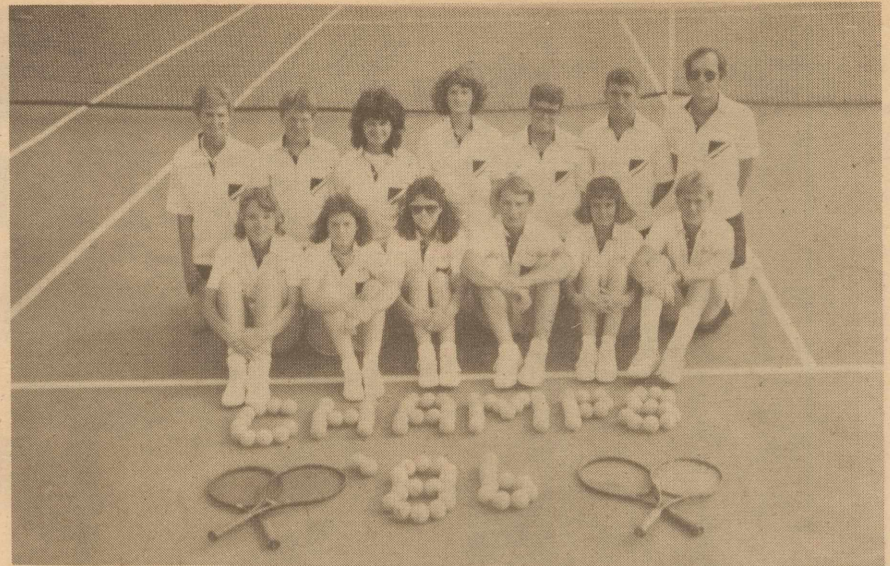

## Bids Accepted From 155 Farmers

Bids on only 31,298 acres of land in Texas were accepted by the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Conservation Reserve Program for 1986. Bids were accepted from 155 farmers.

The state was divided into seven bidding pools. The highest bid accepted for pools 1, 2 and 3 were \$35 per acre on 26,251 acres. These three pools made up the western half of the state.

Bids of up to \$40 per acre were accepted for pools 4, 5 and 6 on 3,511 acres. This area includes South Texas, the Texas Blacklands and East Texas.

Bids up to \$50 per acre were accepted for pool 7 on 1,536 acres; this pool covers the Coastal Prairie and the Lower Rio Grande Valley.

Nationally, bids were made by 44,480 farmers on 4.8 million acres.

Some 10,307 bids were accepted on 838,356 acres. Accepted bids ranged from \$5 to \$90.

Cropland that is in Land Capability Class VI, VII and VIII or land that appeared to be eroding at greater than 3.5 times the tolerance level at sign-up time is automatically accepted. Land that appeared to be eroding between 2.5 to 3.5 times the

tolerance level was declared questionable; Soil Conservation Service personnel will determine final estimated erosion rates on a field by field visit to this land.

Any questionable land that is determined to be eroding at an estimated rate of more than three times the tolerance level with an acceptable bid will be placed in the reserve.

In determining estimated erosion, SCS personnel use the Universal

Soil Loss Equation for water erosion and the Wind Erosion Equation for wind erosion.

SCS conservationists are now in the process of preparing conservation plans on land accepted in CRP. Cropland will be planted to grasses and legumes, wildlife plantings, windbreaks or trees.

For land accepted into CRP, farmers will receive their per acre bid annually shortly after October 1 for ten years. They will also receive 50 percent cost-share assistance for establishing permanent vegetation or trees.

The sign-up period for the 1987 reserve is scheduled to begin May 5.



Mrs. Pierre StRomain, representing Plains Chamber of Commerce, presented each elementary student

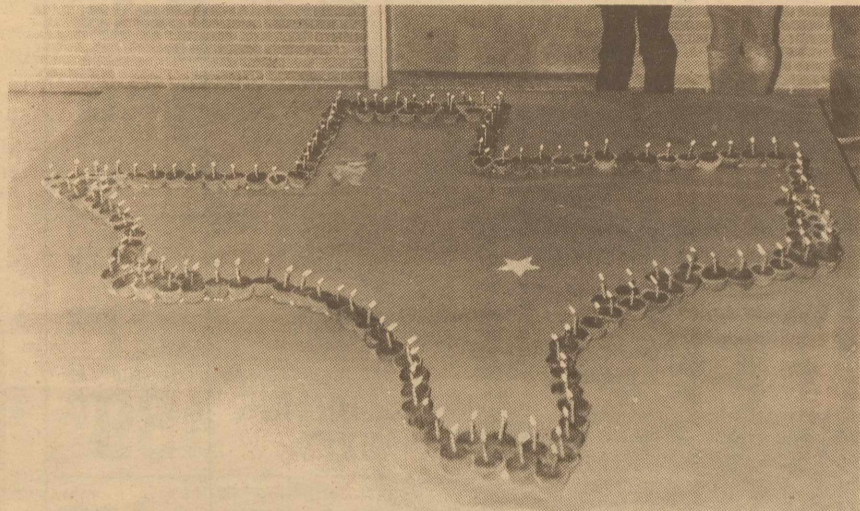
with a sesquicentennial pin.

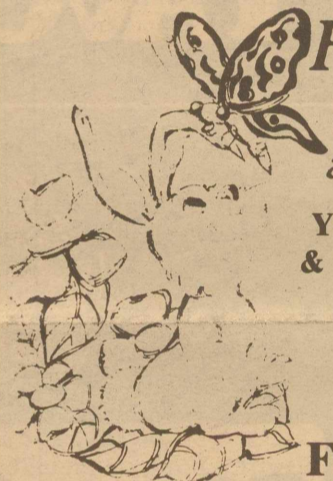

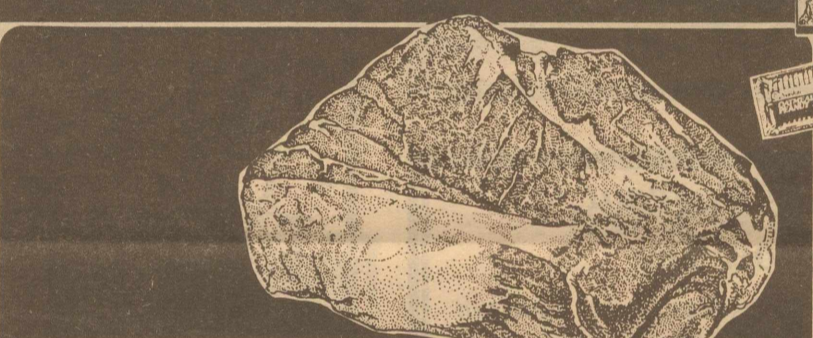


