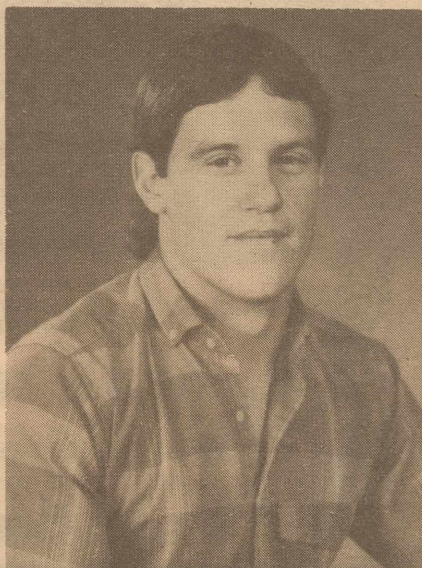

Our sincere thanks go to: the Jim Barron family for their loving welcome, and the strawberries; to the Evertt McAdams family for their kindness and friendship; to Sarah Guetersloh for the Dr. Peppers and encouragement; to our family, Paula and Richie Cullins, for semi-adopting our kids at times; to Kelley and Randy Clay for showing us how the carpet cleaner worked just in time to keep us from flooding the house; to Beth Ann Cain for always being there; and to all our friends and neighbors who helped move furniture, waved "hello" to welcome us, or simply kept our spirits up with words of encouragement. We wish we could name you all. You each add a beautiful personal meaning to the words "friend" and "neighbor".

There is also someone in our neighborhood who has really added a new dimension to the concept of being a neighbor. Moving into a new house and new yard presented us with a lot to learn about the new property, and with many repairs to be made. In particular, we thought we had properly repaired a piece of broken fence. We were sadly mistaken. Friends found our small dog poisoned and dying in their yard. He was apparently trying to get back to our yard and died not a quarter of a block from our home.

We realize we are responsible for our pets and our dog should not have been out of the fence. However, we left early one morning and returned to find the fence in

Absentee Voting Begins May 28

Absentee voting by personal appearance will begin Wednesday, May 28 for the Democratic Primary Run-Off Election. It will continue through Tuesday, June 3. Votes may be cast from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays at the County Clerk's office in the Courthouse in Plains or Branch Office in the Denver City Community Building.

Run-off elections were made necessary for three offices as a result of Primary balloting. Gary Don Ford and Toni Jones are seeking the post of treasurer. Dallas Brewer and H.K. Henniger will battle for the county judge position while Billie Blundell and A.G. Brantley seek the spot of Justice of the Peace, Precinct 1.

Yoakum residents will vote in a number of places including Precinct 1-5, Sligo Community Building; Precinct 1-6, Precinct 1 Barn at 139 E. Broadway in Denver City; Precinct 2-2, Yoakum County Library, 205 W. 4th Street in Denver City; Precinct 2-7, Denver City Community Building, West 15th; Precinct 3-8, City Hall of Denver City; Precinct 4-1, Yoakum County Tax Office, 1010 N. Main, Denver City; Precinct 4-4, Plains Youth Center and Precinct 3-3, Yoakum County Library in Plains.

need of repair, and our dog dead! Our dog had a collar AND TAGS! He was small and not a bit "aggressive" or "vicious". He was not destructive. Given the chance we would have done something about the dog being out and remending the fence. However an animal lured onto property with food which has been poisoned has no second chance, no warning, and no defense. Protecting one's property is one thing; luring animals with food which has been poisoned in the name of protecting one's property is another.

Our friends described watching the animal suffer as they tried to save it. The dog could not move his body, yet lost control of all of his other body functions. He frothed at the mouth as he lay there. Death by poisoning is horrendous.

We ask this "neighbor" to help us explain to our children why their dog was killed this way. Help us describe his death to them when they ask us how he died. Justify our dog's death to our children -because we can't.

From The Superintendent's Desk

There is much talk these days about current oil prices and how they will affect the state as far as funds for operating the state government are concerned. Since our tax base will also be affected, we have some of the same concerns but on a much smaller basis.

This week we received our official estimated values from the Yoakum County Appraisal District. We lost 17.7% of our mineral value for taxation purposes. The certified mineral value is \$777,026,200.00, and the local property value is \$50,920,000.00 to give a total taxable value of \$827,946,870.00. Our current tax base is \$947,796,000.00 and at a tax rate of thirty-four cents per one hundred dollars value we generated \$3,222,506.00. We used \$622,971.00 of our carry-over funds to meet the current budget of \$3,845,477.00.

If our budget were to remain the same for 1986-87 as it is for the 1986-87 as it is for the 1985-86 school year, it would require an additional 5.40 cents per one hundred dollars value (a 39.40 cent tax rate) to meet the budget. If we were to generate all monies to meet the current budget and not use our carry-over funds, it would require a tax rate of 46.50 cents per one hundred dollars valuation.

These are estimates of the values of our school district and are not official in any way at this time but as we plan to build a budget for the 1986-87 school year, these are values we have to consider.

Our thoughts and efforts for planning for next year are consistent with economic conditions; however we know that quality education for every student takes priority in our community. We have all faced tough times in the past and with perseverance have overcome them. This time will be no different if we all pull together. Let's hope and pray for a good rain and higher oil prices.
