Vaughn Culwell Presents Safety Video To Plains FFA

To encourage the proper use of outdoor power equipment, a videotape containing seven safety films was presented to Joe Pierce, advisor and Keith Earnest, president of Plains FFA Chapter, by Vaughn Culwell, owner of Plains Farm Supply, Inc.
"We recognize that the ultimate key to safety is the attitude of the equipment operator," Culwell said. "That's why we urge people to use the safety devices built into the machines, follow instructions and warnings, and learn proper procedures. The videotape promotes a good safety attitude.'
For farm equipment operators, there are four segments. The first is "Accidents Last Forever" in which people talk about accidents and what they learned from their mistakes. "Target: You! Combine Safety" uses a cartoon character named "Gotta Go Joe" to explain safe combining procedures. Another segment titled "Target: You! Tractor Safety" does the same for farm tractors. The fourth segment - "Dangers of Bypass Starting" - illustrates what can happen when operators start a tractor with a screwdriver instead of a key.
For heavy equipment operators, there is "Split Seconds, Split Lives" a series of accident situations related to actual victims or their survivors.
For homeowners and commercial mowing crews, there is "A Positive Safety Attitude" that depicts potentially hazardous operating conditions and provides safety tips from
near-miss testamonials. For families there is "A Mowing Safety Lesson", that shows a father giving his teenage son a first mowing lesson.
"The FFA can help us get the word out that a positive safety attitude must be in our minds everyday," Culwell said. "As the John Deere slogan says -- SAFETY, LIVE WITH IT."
