

## Plans Finalized For Plains' 35th Annual Rodeo Reunion



Excitement is building in Plains as plans are being finalized for the 35th Annual Old Settlers Reunion and Rodeo. The big event is set for Thursday through Saturday, Aug. 4-6.

A rodeo parade will launch the fun-filled weekend beginning at 5:30 p.m. Thursday. Clubs, organizations and individuals interested in participating in the parade are invited.

Nightly performances of the rodeo will begin Thursday with the initial grand entry at 8 p.m. Events will include bareback riding, saddle bronc riding, calf roping, team roping, membership roping, bulldogging, ladies barrel racing and ladies breakaway roping.

Maverick Rodeo Company of Tulia will supply rodeo stock.

Recognition of the 1988 Rodeo Queen will be Saturday evening. Candidates are Sally Burrus, sponsored by Plains Roping Club; Michelle Lowe, sponsored by Plains Lions Club and Becky Ellis, sponsored by Plains Chamber of Commerce.

Winner of the queen title will be the candidate who accepts the most \$1 donations for a saddle which will be given away Saturday evening.

Saturday will be highlighted by an Old Settlers Barbecue Meal at noon in Stanford Park. Barbecue and the trimmings will be served for \$4 for adults and \$3 for children under 12 years. The fee also includes admission to the Saturday night rodeo performance.

Women of the community are asked to prepare potato salads and cobblers to be served at the noon barbecue. Volunteers are also needed to help serve.

## From The Superintendent's Desk

The State Board authorized changing the Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills testing dates for grades 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9 from February to October beginning with the 1990-91 school year. The scope of the TEAMS testing program will also be broadened to coincide with the addition of a written composition on the exit level exam taken by 11th graders.

The name of the tests will become the Texas Assessment Program (TAP) to reflect the changes. Under terms of the broadened program, the board authorized that:

\*The content eligible for testing at all grades will include more of the instructional areas outlined in the State Board of Education Rules for Curriculum. The test will focus on those skills identified in the TEAMS program as needing additional instructional emphasis (such as problem solving, reading comprehension, and life skills).

\*A portion of this expanded set of instructional targets will be assessed annually but every skill in an instructional area will not be tested every year.

\*October test results in math and reading for all grades will be returned within three weeks of testing so that they may be used for early remediation. Results of the writing test will be sent to districts in mid-December.

\*A norm-referenced test component will be added to the new assessment tests at grades 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9 to provide an expanded measure of student performance across all ability levels - and to permit accurate comparisons with various national populations.

The board also adopted the new TEAMS tests to be used in all odd-numbered grade levels during the upcoming school year. The commissioner has recommended maintaining the passing standard at 70 percent or more of items tested. The board also authorized the commissioner to appoint an Advisory Committee on Student Assessment to make recommendations regarding the student testing program. The committee will consist of about 25 members from local school districts.

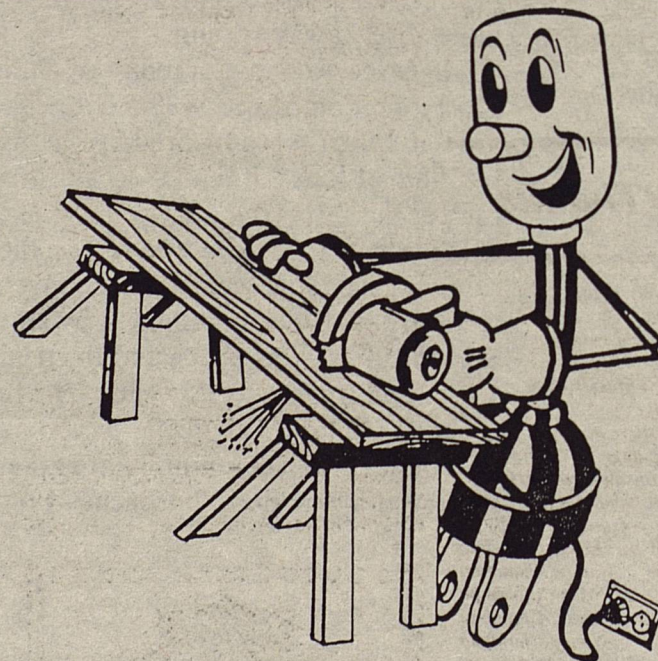
