



Burial was in Plains Cemetery under direction of Singleton Funeral Home of Denver City.


Garza died at 5:31 a.m. Friday in Lubbock General Hospital after a lengthy illness.

He was in band his freshman, sophomore and junior years and was in industrial arts his freshman and junior years.


As a senior, Joel participated in broadcasting at KPLN.

He received consumer math award, physical science and was Outstanding Band Student as a freshman; won consumer education award as a junior.


Joel's hobbies include hunting, fishing, and playing softball during summer months.

He participated in one-act-play as a crew member his sophomore year in the play "Rainmaker" and as a junior he played the part of Charles in "Death of a Salesman."


Kevin was a 4-H member all four years in high school and was in industrial arts his sophomore, junior and senior years.

Also named to All District Academic Tennis, he played tennis four years and basketball his freshman, sophomore and junior years.


