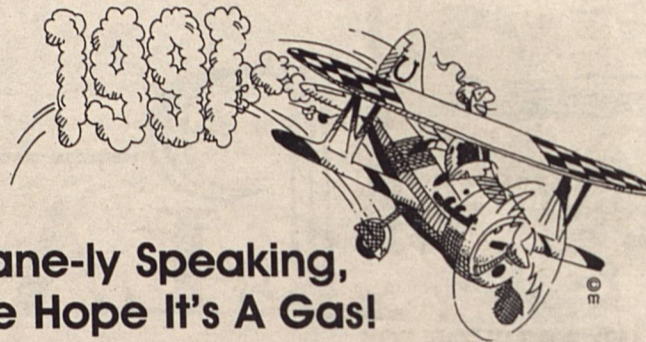

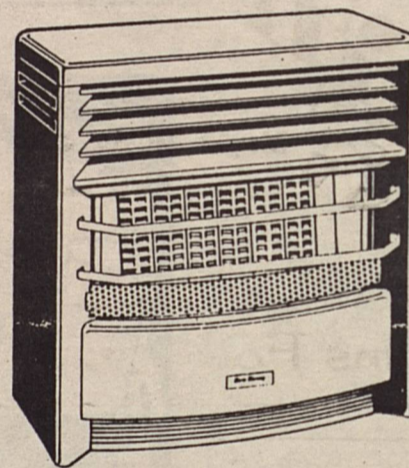

On The Hard Court

Cowgirls

With two wins and a loss in the Plains Tournament this past weekend, the Cowgirls took second place for the second tournament in a row. In round robin action, Plains defeated Jal, N.M. and Lubbock Trinity but lost to Ropes for the title.

In their first game against Lubbock, Plains led from start to finish, but it was a strong finish that gave them their impressive margin of victory 50-17. Leading 10-3 at the end of the first quarter, Plains never could seem to put the Lady Lions away until the last stanza, where they exploded for 21 points. Melissa Green and Ashlee Winn led in scoring for Plains with 11 and 10 points respectively. Daphne Lowe hit 8 followed by Leslie Patton with 6, Jo Lena Powell made 5, Jenifer Fillingim and Shannon Squyres each had 4, and Brandy Lester made 2. Brandy led in field goal percentage with 50% hitting 1 of 2. Melissa led in free throw percentage with 100% hitting 2 of 2. Leslie and Melissa led in steals with 6 each. Melissa led in rebounds with 12 followed by Daphne with 9, Ashlee with 7, and Jo Lena with 6. Leslie and Jenifer tied in assists with 3 each.

Against Ropes, bad luck hit the Cowgirls from the beginning as Jo Lena was injured during warm-up. Then Plains unfortunately hit their lowest percentage of the year. Despite trailing by a

large margin by haltime, the Cowgirls came out ready to play the third quarter as they outscored Ropes 11-0 in the third period. Foul trouble hampered Plains most of the game as Melissa fouled out early in the third quarter and Ashlee, Leslie and Daphne played much of the game with four fouls. With the fouls, came the free throws, where Plains hit 5 of 10 compared to Ropes' 22 of 32. In the 53-29 loss, Leslie led in scoring with 10 points, followed by Ashlee with 8. Shannon made 4 and Melissa hit 3. Jenifer and Daphne each hit 2. Shannon led in field goal percentage with 50%, as did Melissa, both hitting 1 of 2. Shannon also led in free throw percentage with 100%. Leslie led in steals with 5 followed by Ashlee with 4. Daphne and Ashlee led in rebounds with 3 each. Leslie and Melissa led in assists with 2 each.

Plains had a close battle in their third game against Jal. The Cowgirls jumped out to a quick lead and held a two point margin 10-8, at the end of the first period. Tied at haltime the Cowgirls came out and held a four point lead, 32-28, entering the last quarter. Clinch free throw shooting by Melissa Green gave Plains a 46-41 win and their fifth win of the year. Leslie led a trio of double figure scorers with 12 points followed by Jenifer and Melissa with 10 each. Daphne followed with 8 points and Ashlee hit 6 to round out the total.

Daphne led in field goal percentage with 75% followed by Jenifer with 63%. Ashlee led in free throw percentage with 100% followed by Daphne with 67%. Melissa led in steals and Daphne and Jenifer tied for honors in rebounds with 9 each followed by Ashlee with 8 and Melissa with 7. Melissa led in assists with 5 and Leslie had 3.

The Cowgirls now have a season record of 5-5 with the next game being during the holidays. Plains will travel to Sundown for the Sundown Tournament on Dec. 27, 28 and 29. They will play Sundown on Thursday, at 9 a.m. They will then face either Texico, N.M. or Petersburg the next day.

JV Girls

After a close opening loss to Shallowater in the Sundown JV Tournament, the Plains JV Cowgirls stormed back to take their next two games over Whiteface and O'Donnell to gain consolation honors.

In the first round, Plains faced Shallowater and lost by a narrow margin of 40-35. Amy Crutcher led in scoring with 11 points followed by Rhonda Cowart with 9. Also scoring were Oglia Ramirez and Andrea Salas with 4 each. Mandi Davis scored 3 and Heather Bowlin and Monica Flores each had 2.

The next game saw Plains face Whiteface. Leading from beginning to end, Plains opened up a 24-15 haltime lead and extended it to 34-17 entering the last quarter. In the 37-26 win, Amy Crutcher again led in scoring with 10 points, followed by Heather Bowlin and Rhonda Cowart with 8 each. Oglia Ramirez scored 7 followed by Shandy Willett and Andrea Salas with 2 each.

In the Consolation final, Plains met O'Donnell and after getting out to a slow start, came storming back for a 36-28 win. Trailing at one point by ten, Plains rallied late to pull to within four, 14-10, by the end of the first quarter. The Eagles edged ahead 24-16 by the end of the first half of play, but the second half was all Cowgirls. Changing defenses, Plains held the Lady Eagles to four points in the third quarter and the Cowgirl defense held O'Donnell scoreless in the final period of play for an eight point win. Scoring for Plains was once again Amy Crutcher with 12 points followed by Heather Bowlin with 10. Oglia Ramirez hit 8 points and Rhonda Cowart rounded out the scoring with 6.

Congratulations to the Plains Cowgirls for their excellent showing in the Sundown JV Tournament. Next game for the JV girls will be after the holidays, Jan. 4, against Lubbock Christian. The games will be here starting at 5 p.m.

Jr. High Girls

The Plains Wranglers dropped three close games to Seagraves here Monday night. The Seventh Grade girls were defeated 28-16, the Eighth Grade lost 20-17, and the Ninth Grade dropped a close 17-16.

The Seventh Grade jumped out to an 8-1 lead at the end of the first quarter and still led 10-5 at haltime. Seagraves came storming back in the second half and forged ahead for the win. Amanda Koncaba led in scoring with 8 points followed by Valarie Blair with 5. Silvia Tarango added 3 to the total.

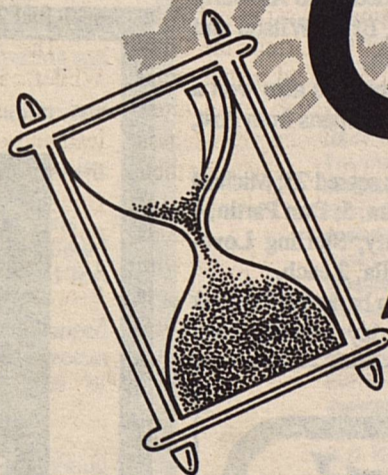

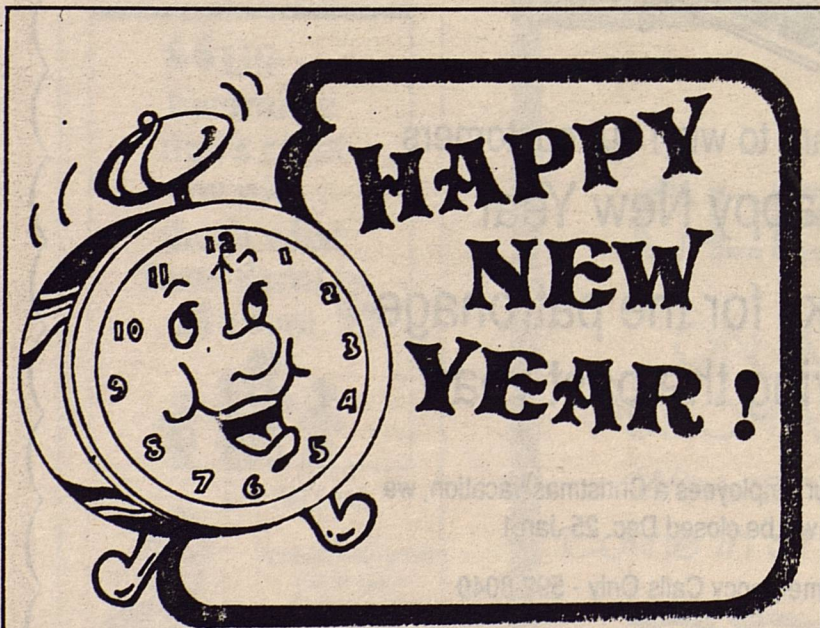
