The Rev. Glenn Harlin of Odessa, and the Rev. Bill Perkins, pastor, officiated. Burial was in Plains Cemetery under direction of Connally Funeral Home.

Mr. Sims died Friday in Brownfield Regional Medical Center.

Born Nov. 16, 1897 in Blue Ridge, he left home at 14 and started work on the Spade Ranch west of Lubbock. Throughout the years, he worked for Mashed O at Springlake Camp, Circle Bars near Lubbock and Mulligan Ranch near Hale Center. In 1944, he began work for the Ty Field T7 Ranch. He retired at the age of 86 after devoting his life to being a working cowpuncher.

He married Lexa Springer July 7, 1938 in Olton.

Survivors include his wife; two sons, Bobby of Big Spring and Clark (Butch) of Dallas; three daughters, Betty (Sis) Trout of Hobbs, NM, Sue Billings of Seagraves and Tommy Jan James of Enid, OK; 10 grandchildren; 11 great-grandchildren and a sister, Mary Frances Cate of Houston.

Former Students Slate Reunion

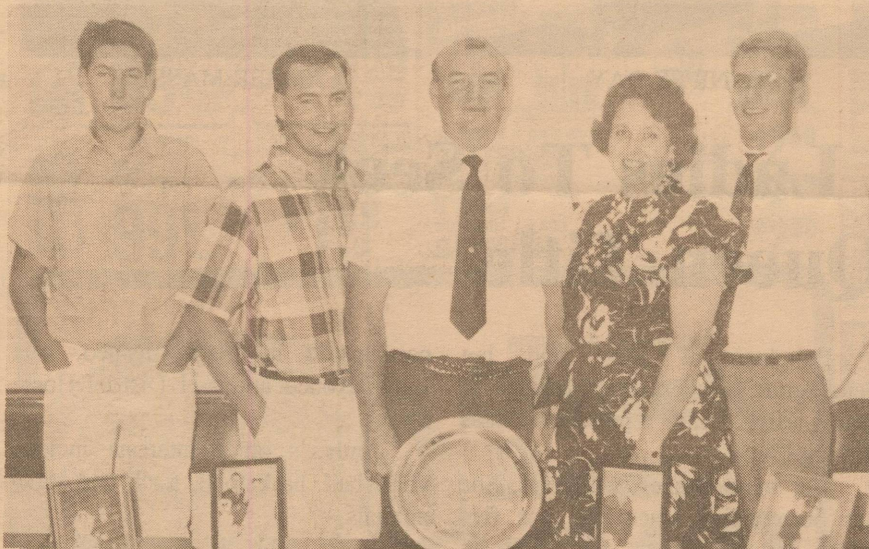
Former students of Plains schools and their families are invited to a fellowship gathering at 2 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 3 in the school cafeteria.

Friends and relatives are invited. The Alexander home is located at 1201 4th Street in Plains.

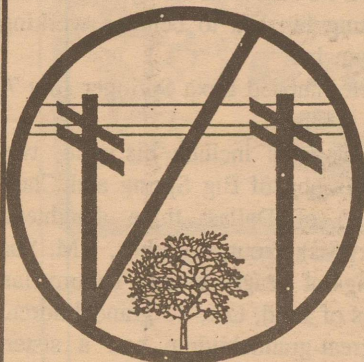

The little seedlings you plant now will someday have big branches. If those branches fall or bend in a storm, they could break power lines. That means you and your neighbors could be without electric service for several hours.

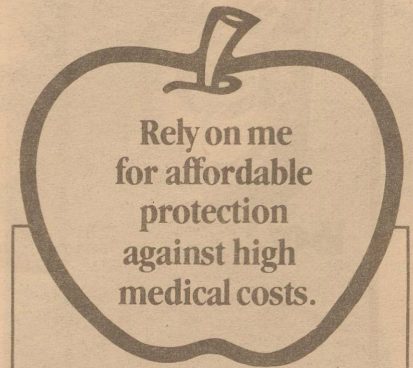

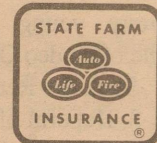
