

Jason Smith has signed a letter of meter runs. His 1600 meter relay team intent to run track for South Plains College Texans.

Son of Hershel and Debbie Smith, he has been a member of the State Runner-Up Cross Country Team two consecutive years. He was also selected All-District Basketball; unanimous All-District Wide Receiver; All South Plains Wide Receiver and All State Wide Receiver.
