



Last Saturday at Washington, D. C., Tom Reed died very suddenly of Bright's Disease.

Mr. Reed, or "Czar Reed," as he was familiarly known, was one of the brainest if not the brainest man in America. His remarkable career in congress was unprecedented, he having served in that august body for 22 years and was speaker of the house a number of times. He resigned the speakership and declined re election because he was not in sympathy with McKinley's Philippince policy. After his resignation he went into the law practice in New York on a guaranteed salary of \$50,000 in the interest of one of that city's leading corporations.

Reed was born, reared and educated at Portland, Maine, and graduated at Bowdoin College, the same college at which Longfellow, the famous and most beloved American poet, was a graduate.

He died at the Arlington Hotel, Washington, D. C., with his family present.


