The officers were notified and Sheriff Cirley of Decatur, Deputy Sheriff Prior and Constables Yeary and Dobbs were on hand to receive them. Some of the officers were posted inside the bank and others across the street where the approach could be commanded. All were heavily armed. One of the robbers remained outside to hold the horses while the other two went in to rob the bank. As they went in they did not notice the officers and covered the cashier and demanded all the money in the vault. 
Differing Opinions as to Cancer.
