LANDON NATIONAL BANK.

A Third National Bank for San Angelo With \$100,000 Capital, A Strong Institution.

The Press was "on" the middle of last week; but not in time to give the news in last Wednesday's paper. However, it's a fact, and it means much to San Angelo.

The application for charter was mailed to the controller at Washington last Sunday for the organization of the Landon National Bank of San Angelo, Texas, with a capital stock of \$100,000. The promoters of this bank are among the best known and most substantial business men in this section and every dollar of the capital will be home money.

Those in on the ground floor are, Cicero Smith the lumber king, sonior partner of Smith Hail & Co.; B. B. Hail of the same firm; J C. Landon the popular hotel man: Ed Jackson the Sonora banker and stockman; Tom McCloskey the popular San Angelo business man, and some thing. others.

The elegant store room adjoin ing the office in the new Landon hotel has been secured permaneatly for the business and by the time the building is completed, which is expected to be about June 1st, the bank will be ready for business. The promoters propose to place stock with San Angelo parties who wish to interest themselves in the new institution, and such shares as are not thus placed will be taken by one of the parties mentioned above, to the extent of \$90,000 if neces sary San Angelo now has two national banks, each with a capital stock of \$100,000, with surplus and profits amounting to \$183,000, and a strong private banking institution, and the fact that business has attained sufficient proportions to justify another, speaks volumes for the commercial activity of our city, and indicates a healthy growth in business matters. The volume of this branch of business is accepted as an accurate estimate of the financial condition of any community and San Angelo may well be proud of the distinction thus attained.-San An-I gelo Press.


Chicago, Ill., March 24.-A dispatch to the Tribune from 21 Rate \$7.45 for round trip. Mount Vernon, Ill., says:



He is willing for you to succeed, but if you do it under his roof you must be of some genuine value there. The reputation of your ancestors will not help you along; it will take the sweat of your own brow and the cunning of your own brain. I do not wish to depreciate the

value of home training; the char acters that insure the future safety of our republic are moulded and shaped at the fireside; the parental training is the best we will ever get in this world. But it is well enough for every boy who has got to get on the stage of action and play a part in life's game to know just what is what, to know that he has got a battle royal before him that can only be won by the use of grit, industry and common sense. This world is a coldblooded affair, it is selfish and no man is going to pat you on the back and say, "Onward Christian brother," until you are in a position to reciprocate. A smile is a fine thing and every boy should have one ready to cast at whom soever, but to be able to loan a "fiver" insures more friends. These are cold realities and the boy that is "on" is better able for the fray. I know that such things are not generally taught on paper, but when we go up against the business world we learn the lesson. It is all right for the orator or the poet to sing in silvery tones of success, the reward of the honest heart, but the man who has been there has a far different tale to tell.
