Saloons or no saloons-that is the question. In this contes you are not asked to choose between saloons and "blind tigers" for prohibitionists in general join with the offlcers of the county in saying that if prohibition carries in the coming election there will be no "blind tigers" in this county

According to the Supreme Court of the United States the 6atoons produce more crime and misery than any other agency on

In this county for the past two years and a half, to go back no curther, the saloons have been the cius of anre than one-third of the criminal cases that have been recorded on the criminal dockets of our courts. Surely the voters of this county will not vote to sell the right to exist to institutions that are doing so much *o blacken the otherwise fair name of our county.

The question is before you to decide. The responsibility for the results of the decision will also be on you.

Friends of prohibition are urged to be earnest and active. Avoid strife and bitterness, yet as citizens responsible for the public policies of your county be zealous. Appeal with persuasion and entreaty to your neighbor, yet do not become offended at him if he does not agree with you. Let brotherly love continut. Allow younself to become offensive to no one. Abuse and boycott may be used by others but prohibitionists rest their case only on the merits of facts and the inevitable logic of the situation and thus expect to win.
