# PINK WORM KNOCKEDON LAND VALUES

AUSTIN, May 29 .- The pink boll worm investigation will be completed today, according to a statement by counsel representing those interested in the legis ation:. The sub-committee bill proposing to regulate cotton zone expected to receive consideration today. The sentiment of a ma jority joint committee seems to favor this bill over the Tilloton bill which proposes non-cottor zones in accordance with the de nands of the federal departmen of agriculture.






