

# Trade at Home Contest Closes Winners Announced

The prize winning article entered by Miss Helen Hardon of Ballinger, was printed in The Banner-Ledger of last week. Following the article entered by Miss Octa Crowson of Winters, which won the second prize:

"When trading at home, we have the opportunity of inspecting what we buy, thus assuring ourselves of good quality before buying.

"We economize in at least one way by saving shipping expenses, and often time and expense in correcting mistakes, made sometimes by the firm, but often by the customers themselves.

"Then there is always a long delay in trading away from home, and one often fails to get one's order filled because the demand for same has been greater than the supply.

"In nearly every instance, the money taken in by our business men is kept at home, and much of it is put into the upbuilding of our home towns. So, in trading at home, we not only patronize our town friends, but share in making our county better than it is today.
