GOVERNMENT ASKS ALL TO GIVE W.S.S. FOR XMAS PRESENTS

The Government is asking every one to give War Savings Stamps for Christmas gifts this year instead of the kind of presents usually given.

"The Government's requirements," declares Secretary William O. M. Adoo, "were never greater nor more pressing than they are today." In his report to Congress several days ago, dealing with the need the Government has for money to pay for labor and materials already used, the Secretary pointed out that the expenditures necessary for the month of November were greater than in any similar period in the history of the United States.

When presents other than Government securities are given labor and materials needed by the Government for reconstruction purposes are used up and diverted from the Government's use. When money is spent for Christmas presents other than War Savings Stamps, money that the Government needs is withheld from the Government.
