THESE HUNS GOT TO PARIS

Paris, Feb. 10 (By Mail)-When German shows up in Paris, it's a sensation. So far only eight have succeeded in reaching the French capital, and all have been quickly rounded up by the police. The latest arrival was a wealthy individual, who just easually came over from Hanover. He registered at one of the best hotels, and kept the police busy for hours trying to find out how he got here.

Immediately after the signing of the armistice conditions on the old fighting front were in a very fluid state. Getting into France from Germany from France was an easy matter. Seven Germans including a woman, crossed the frontier at this time and reached Paris. They came by train with returning soldiers and civilians. All immediately were arrested, and explained that they lived in Paris before the war and thought that the signing of the armistice permitted their return.

Rue Marechal Joffre, Rue Foch, Rue Gouraud, Rue Petain, and Rue Castelnan have already been formally christained. However, old French names are not being forgotten and Rue Gambetta, Rue Deroulde, Rue Turenne, Rue J. J. Rousseau and Rue Vauban are now down on the city's street list A few of the other new ones are Avenue de la Marseillaise, Avenue Rue De Verdun, Rue de Rhemes, Rue de l'Argonne, Rue de Liege, Rue de l'Yser, and Rue du Cercle, the latter in rememberance of the hate kept up in the students' circles throughout the German occupation against the Hun.
