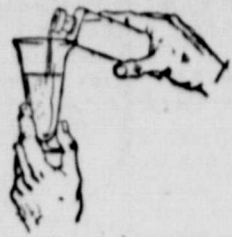

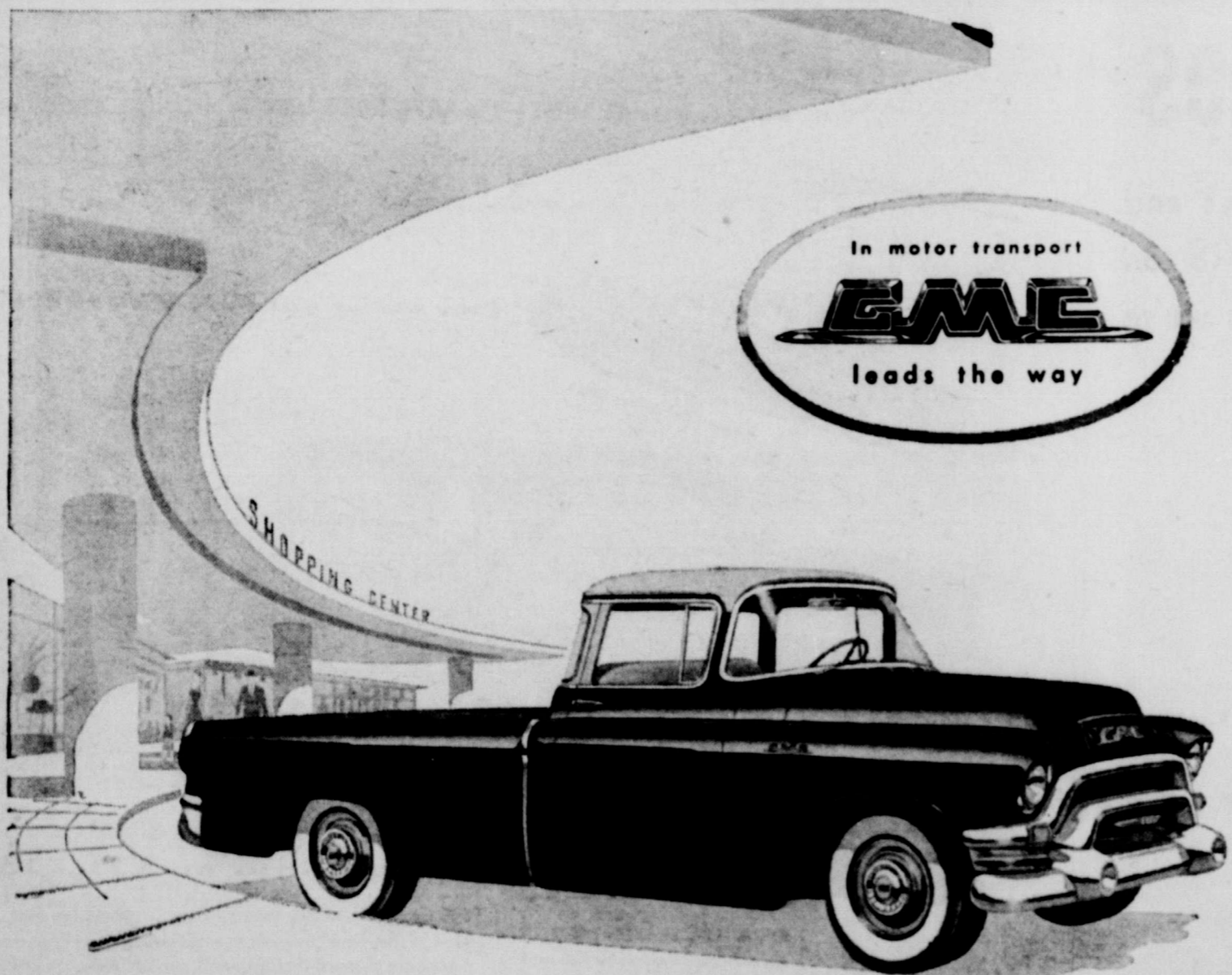

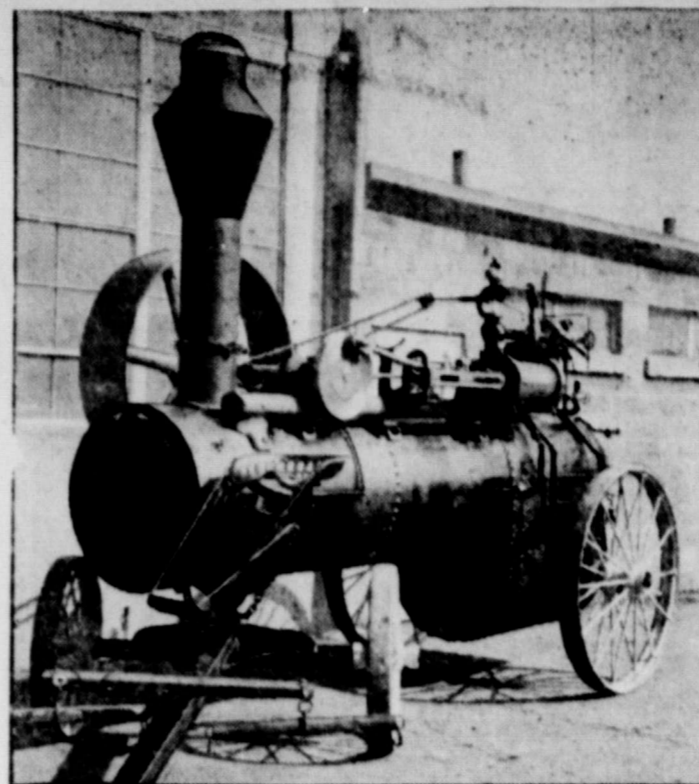
COLEMAN DELEGATION BOOSTS RODEO HERE

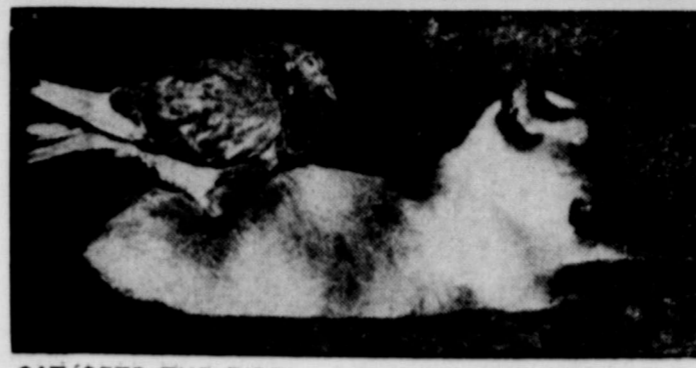
