





LANDOWNERS URGED TO STUDY SOIL BANK

The Supervisors of the Runnels Soil Conservation District suggest that every landowner and operator study carefully the provisions of the Soil Bank program as to how it might be used on their farm. Full details of the Acreage Reserve and the Conservation Reserve portions of this program can be obtained at the local Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation office. For many farms, this program presents a real opportunity to get the type of conservation job done on some land that has been dreamed of but not achieved. Getting a good cover of grass on steep, poor, or badly eroded cropland and the inclusion of a definite soil improvement rotation, are two of the practices that should not be overlooked in making the study. It is suggested that interested farmers get the details from the county ASC office and then see the local Soil Conservation Service techniclans for help on selecting the land to be put in the program and the practices which will be best suited to the land.






