Our third daughter Evelyn and her family live in Amarillo Block franchise in Hereford.





News from the archives of the Friona Star in 1975

July 6, 1975 – The Friona Star was the winner of an award presented at the 96th annual summer convention of the Texas Press Association last weekend at El Paso. The Star received a second place award in the "appearance" contest for newspapers published in cities and towns of 2,500 to 4,500 population.

August 31, 1975 - Cleanup

operations were going full speed near Summerfield Friday, following a massive derailment involving about 25 cars of an eastbound Santa Fe freight train. The derailment happened about 1:15 p.m. Thursday at the crossing at the Big Tex Elevator, just west of Cattle Town Feed Yard. The cars were strewn along a quarter-mile length of track.

November 2, 1975 - Ernest Osborn delivered the first bale of cotton in Friona for 1975. He brought the bale to Friona Farmer Co-op Gin on Thursday, October 30. Tom Byars is the gin manager. The bale weighed 500 pounds, came from 2300 pounds of seed cotton. The first bale yielded 780 pounds of seed.

He assured her he was fine because even though he was "sorta" homeless (whatever that means), he had a package of cigarettes, a warm cup of coffee, and some money.

After repeatedly asking him if she could take him somewhere, the man told her he just thanked Jesus for people like her who stopped to check on him.

I told my friend she probably encountered more of Jesus in her short visit with the man than she did at her church meeting. She said that was true, but the thing that amazed her was how little it took to make the man content.

Now, I have thought about this story from MANY angles, but the question that keeps coming to mind is: what makes me content? Living like the man my friend encountered would not make me content; I don't like the cold, and I don't smoke or drink coffee.

But, I have a lot of "stuff"...that I like ...and I like the way my house looks with my "stuff". The thing I have learned from this is to make sure my contentment comes from Jesus and not my stuff; true contentment is found in Jesus. To find more contentment in material things is elevating "stuff" above Jesus, and that is wrong. For now, I need to do some soul searching to see if my contentment is the result of Jesus in my life or all the "stuff" I have.
