

## Treasure Trust, Transparency and Truth

Universities have lost the public trust. Pew, Gallop, and a number of other assemblers of public opinion have studied and reported findings that suggest public trust in Higher Education is eroding. University of Oregon president Michael Schill in a University World News post proposed several causes of evaporating trust. Anti-intellectualism, a lack of diversity, indoctrination, erosion of shared or common interests by increasingly loud and narrowly focused interest groups and a host of other legitimate reasons rob institutional trust.

Universities do not have the market cornered on institutional distrust. Forty percent of Americans queried by Gallup in 1973 said they trusted institutions. By 1979 it had climbed to 51%, and then over the years has descended to a rate of about 20%. Congress led

This notice concerns 2018 property tax rates for PARMER COUNTY HOSPITAL. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. 

## **Psalm 86—Ingredients for Prayer**

#### Brett Hoyle, Pastor, First Baptist Church

If you were going to make a delicious cake, what would you put in it? Flour, chocolate, sugar, chocolate, milk, chocolate, eggs, chocolate, and a little more chocolate may be part of your recipe, all for the purpose of making a delicious dessert. In dessert making there are specific ingredients you put in which render a certain product. Similarly, in prayer, there are essential aspects to Christ honoring prayer, and you read about a few in Psalm 86.

Psalm 86 is a heartfelt prayer of David that breaks down into three parts. First is his petition for the Lord to hear and answer his prayer (v1-7). Then he moves into praising

God for who God is and what God has done in his life. This essential aspect of prayer calls for scriptural meditation on the wonder of who God is as well as pondering the works He has accomplished. When prayer includes significant time of praising and meditating on who God is, it transforms the requests that you make in your prayers. For example, the final section of Psalm 86 is verse 14-17 where David pleas for God's help. Verse 14 depicts a very urgent problem in which "a band of ruthless men seek my life, and they do not set you before them." In other words, the mob was after David, which is a serious problem, but he an-

chors his soul and hope in who God is, followed by what God can do. Many prayers would have turned immediately to 'Lord slay the wicked and my enemies' but David recalls God's mercy, grace, patience, love and faithfulness and asks God for strength through trial, salvation from above, and for a sign that his enemies would know that God is real.

The desire for God to be glorified in how you pray and what you pray is a key ingredient to Christ honoring prayer! Stop praying "my will be done" and instead pray "Lord, thy will be done" in full trust of who He is, and that whatever answer He gives will be
