



President Wilson has fixed Tuesday, June 5, as the date on which all men liable for military service between the ages 21 and 30 shall register at their respective polling places. / This oes not mean that the men shall enlist in the army on that day, neither is it expected that all who enroll at the time designated shall ever be enlisted in the army. The estimate is that there are ten million men America who have passed their 21st birthday and who have not reached their 31st birthday.
