GOD'S PROMISE TO DAVID
1 Chronicles 17

GOLDEN TEXT—Thy throne, O God, is forever; And the sceptre of uprightness is the sceptre of thy kingdom. Hebrews 1:8.

Lesson Setting and Survey

David was the greatest and best of the Hebrew kings. At the height of his fame and power he desired ardently to build an adequate temple to cultivate and centralize the religious life of his people. He had built up his kingdom by a vigorous foreign policy which had low his enemies on every side, and by an equally vigorous internal policy which knit the tribes to him in a national unity previously unknown. He had fortified his capital city and built a costly palace and brought up the ark of the covenant to Jerusalem. And now the dearest goal of his heart was the erection of a national sanctuary. He was denied the privilege, but his soul was soothed and sustained by the promise of God opening before him the vista of Solomon's temple in its glory, and the Messiah's throne magnificent and unending.

Lesson Text and Outline

1 Chronicles 17: 1-12

I. THE DESIRE OF DAVID.

And it came to pass, when David dwelt in his house, that David said to Nathan the prophet, Lo, I dwell in a house of cedar, but the ark of the covenant of Jehovah dwelleth under curtains.

II. THE DESIGNATION OF DAVID.

2. And Nathan said unto David, Do all that is in thy heart for God is with thee.

III. THE DENIAL OF DAVID.

3. And it came to pass the same night, that the word of God came to Nathan, saying, 4. Go and tell David my servant, Thus saith Jehovah, Thou shalt not build me a house to dwell in: 5. For I have not dwelt in a house since the day that I brought up Israel, unto this day, but have gone from tent to tent, and from one tabernacle to another: 6. In all places wherein I have walked with all Israel, spake I a word with any of the judges of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people, saying, Why have ye not built me a house of cedar? 7. Now therefore thou shalt say unto my servant David, Thus saith Jehovah of hosts, I took thee from the sheepcote, from following the sheep, that thou shouldst be shepherd over my people Israel: 8. and I have been with thee, while thou hast gone, and have cut off thine enemies from before thee; and I will make thee a name like unto the name of the great ones that are in the earth: 9. And I will appoint a place for my people Israel, and will plant them that they may dwell in their own place, and be moved no more; neither shall the children of wickedness waste them any more, as at first, 10. and as from the day that I commanded judges to be over my people Israel; and I will subdue all thine enemies. Moreover I tell thee that Jehovah will build thee a house.

IV. THE DEVELOPMENT OF DAVID.

11. And it shall come to pass, when thy days are fulfilled that thou must go to be with thy fathers, that I will set up thy seed after thee, who shall be of thy sons; and I will establish his kingdom. 12. He shall build me a house, and I will establish his throne forever.

V. THE DESCENDANTS OF DAVID.

Notes Analytical and Expository

1. THE PURPOSE OF THE KING. David was at the Zenith of his strength and ready for what he conceived to be the greatest task of his career. He had a faithful and capable advisor in Nathan the prophet, one of the truest and most trustworthy of the Hebrew counselors. He had built an elegant and commodious house of cedar for himself and his court, materials being brought from the Lebanon mountains under international agreement with Hiram, king of Tyre. He had brought up the ark of the covenant holding within it the Sinaitic tablets of stone and installed that most sacred relic in his capital city. But the ark was under curtains as in the ancient days of wilderness wandering. Since Is-

real had long been settled in Canaan why should not the tabernacle be succeeded by a great temple? The king did not like to live in a cedar mansion while the ark of God was enclosed in a tent. He could build the proposed temple and wanted to do so. His heart's desire was laid before Nathan.

2. THE PERMISSION OF THE PROPHET.

No one in all the land was more desirous of seeing a worthy sanctuary than Nathan the prophet. His life was devoted to the ministry of a spiritual worship. He believed in David, his king. He knew that David was sincere. He realized that the king had the ability to see such a program through to a finish. Indeed the prophet himself may actually have hinted at the erection of the temple. His first impulse therefore was heartily to assent to the purpose of the king. He felt certain of the presence of God with David as in the past and as apparently guaranteed in the proposed enterprise.

3. THE PROHIBITION FROM THE LORD.

Neither the king nor the prophet at first sensed the divine will, pious as were their motives. That same night, therefore, came the truer revelation of God's purpose in regard to the proposed temple. Of course Nathan was the medium of the revelation. And he was told precisely what to tell the king. David must be directly informed that he must not build a house for Jehovah to dwell in at Jerusalem. Perhaps neither the king nor the country was ready for all that was involved in the enterprise. Had they learned the lesson of spirituality in worship? Did they realize that God is not confinable to one locality? Let them remember that his sanctuary had long been a transient and transitory tent, good at every stopping place and good when one curtain replaced another. His manifest walk with Israel had been without any departure for a house. He had not called upon judges as shepherds of Israel to erect a national house of worship. The time was not yet ripe. A period of preparation must precede. David had been a man of war and of politics and he could render greater service in

preparation than in realization.

4. THE PROMISE TO DAVID.

While forbidden to attain the goal of his heart's desire, David nevertheless attained the higher goals of life. The promise which God made to the king was based on God who had taken him from the sheepcote in the fields around Bethlehem and made him first at Hebron and then at Jerusalem prince and king over the people of Israel for a total of twosecure years. He had been attended by the presence of God every step of the way. All his victories over insidious and powerful foes were due directly to divine intervention and blessing. Therefore, the king could rely implicitly upon the divine promise for the future: the promise of a great name for the king himself on the pages of the world's history; a great place and position for the children of Israel as the chosen people and one of the mightiest on the globe; a great mission of security and service; a great line of kings and princes holding the sceptre down through the ages. God was giving David much more than he was withholding from him.

5. THE PROPHECY THROUGH DAVID.

It was foreseen that the king would ere long fulfill his days on earth and then, to use vivid oriental phrase, he would sleep with his fathers. Three great promises flamed forth on the beautiful rainbow over arching the future. The first was that David's successor should be his own son, so that there would not be a change of dynasty as in the case of Saul. The second was that his son should build the house of Jehovah which David desired to build. And third was the promise fulfilled in David's greater son, Jesus of Nazareth, who was duly to appear and whose throne shall survive the wreck of worlds.



THE TEXAS STATE FAIR TO HAVE BETTER AND MORE FIREWORKS



There will be plenty of fireworks at the State Fair of Texas this year, both day and night. The management decided to drop the usual "spectacle" for the next show, Oct. 8 to 23, and to put into actual fireworks the money hitherto spent on the pay rolls for supers to act in these spectacles. Consequently, while there will be no scenery, no parades or stunts, no canvas palaces or toppling down as in Pompeii, Tokyo, the World War and such spectacles, there will be fireworks and a lot of them and all of the best and most brilliant sorts that money can buy. Many people complained that these "shows" were somewhat tame and only detained the crowds who were really desirous of seeing the fireworks and not the preliminaries. So the State Fair management is making the new experiment, believing that by putting the "shows" into better and more fireworks, they will please a larger crowd and give a really better entertainment.

GREATER DEMAND FOR SPACE ON IMPLEMENT ROW AT STATE FAIR



Implement and machinery dealers are evidently looking forward to a banner year in Texas, for not only has there been such a demand for space on the implement row at the State Fair of Texas as has developed this summer...

With all Texas learning the lesson that modern farming pays dividends when properly conducted, with examples on every hand of what others are doing in the line of advanced methods and with bumper crops and good prices in sight, the implement men evidently expect to do business on a grand scale this fall. Hence the demand which has made it necessary to add new space to Implement Row at Fair Park. It is hinted that several new devices of rather startling nature are to be shown by some of the exhibitors.

ANNUAL BARNYARD GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNA- MENT AT STATE FAIR



If there are any horseshoe pitchers in this community who believe that they are able to hold their own with the experts of other places in the State, now comes their chance. The State Fair of Texas will inaugurate its first annual Barnyard Golf Championship Tournament, at the big fair Oct. 8 to 23, "barnyard golf" being the fancy name that has been fastened upon the game of pitching horseshoes. The tournament will be held under the sanction and according to the rules of the National Horseshoe Pitchers' Association, which conducts all such tournaments at the large state fairs in the north and east. The champion who wins this tournament will be eligible to enter the National Tournaments next year, and let us all hope he will bring the national championship to Texas. TEXAS A. & M. COLLEGE TO DEMONSTRATE COTTON GROWING AT STATE FAIR

Texas A. & M. College, which in the past has contented itself with an exhibit at the State Fair consisting of a model of the college grounds and buildings, will this year completely reverse itself and display one of the most interesting demonstrations that possibly could be arranged, it is announced from College Station. It will make an exhibit which will demonstrate every step in the cotton industry from the preparation of the soil for the seed right down to the time the finished cotton fabric is placed in the hands of the consumer.

STATE FAIR OF TEXAS TO OPEN SIX NEW EXIT GATES

Six new exit gates from the grounds of the State Fair of Texas will make it possible to empty the grounds of all cars in from seven to ten minutes, even after the conclusion of the biggest football games, when the cars are thickest. At first but three new exits were planned, but engineers pointed out how and where additional openings could be made and used to aid the crowds in getting away. The former gates will be used for entrance only. No change has been made in those latter locations. The directors of the State Fair of Texas claim that their efforts to give the State Fair ever held has resulted in every individual department being improved 100 per cent over what it was last year or any year in the past. Over a million attendance is expected.

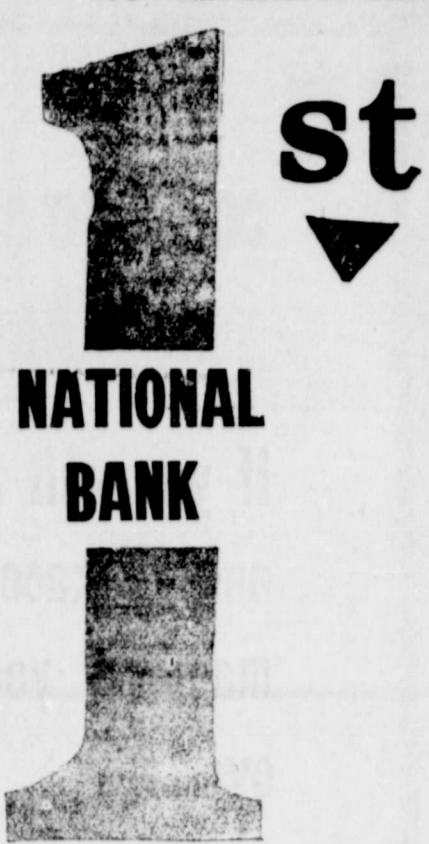

QUESTION BOX

ON HEALTH subjects Edited by
STATE DEPARTMENT of

HEALTH
J. C. Anderson, MD, State H. O.

THIS column will be given to discussion of matters pertaining to public health. Any questions regarding public health administration, prevention of diseases, child care, sanitation, etc., will be answered in succeeding issues of this paper. Questions in regard to cure of diseases will not be answered as the scope of this Department includes only disease prevention. Address Question Box, State Department of Health, Austin.

Questions

1. My little boy does not like milk. How can I overcome this dislike? (Mrs. J. B. M., Bay City).
2. How can cancer be prevented? (J. D., Belton).
3. Which is the highest death rate in Texas, heart disease or tuberculosis? (Mrs. X, Henderson).
4. I have 3 children, and I find that none of them are registered. We had a physician at each of these times and paid his fee promptly. As registration of births is part of a physician's duty, would I not have been justified in withholding such fees until my babies were registered? (Mrs. B.).
5. What foods are recommended for fat people? (Anxious).
6. If smallpox can be prevented, why do we hear of so many cases scattered over the state and the country?
7. Should a baby be allowed to suck a pacifier? (Mother).
8. Why is it that some children will take a communicable disease when exposed to it, and others will not? (Mrs. L. Planc).

Answers

1. A dislike for milk is often acquired by children through having been given at some time, milk of bad odor or taste. It is the natural thing for children to like milk, and the first time a child refuses to drink his glass of milk, the mother should immediately find out the reason. The milk may be of bad quality, and if so, the child shows good sense in not liking it. If this is the reason, be sure that the next milk given him is of good quality, as if he once gets it fixed in his mind that he doesn't like milk, he will thereafter refuse any that is given him. Children are great imitators and often refuse milk, because some other member of the family does not drink it. Every child should drink a quart of milk each day.

2. There is no known prevention of cancer, such as used in prevention of smallpox, diphtheria, and some other diseases. Cancer is a disease of middle or late life and this is one of the reasons why a person should have a health examination once each year after reaching this age. Cancer may be cured in the early stages, but in advanced stages, it becomes a more difficult problem.

3. More people died in Texas last year of heart disease than of any other disease.

3. The mothers of Texas can assist materially in putting Texas in the registration area of the United States, if they will call their physicians and insist that their children be registered.

5. Eat freely of cabbage, lettuce, tomatoes, onions, turnips, greens, carrots, and other filling foods. Eat sparingly of meat, eggs, bread, cereals, and other foods made from grain and grain products. Eat no desserts and no sweets of any kind. Extreme dieting is not recommended for reducing overweight, as the body becomes malnourished, and disease resistance diminishes. Proper physical exercise is the correct method of getting rid of excess fat.

6. The reason that smallpox exists at all is because people refuse to be vaccinated. In Germany, vaccination is compulsory at birth and again in early youth. During the last 10 years, there has been less than 40 cases of smallpox reported in that country, and these were mostly tourists.

7. Mothers long ago learned that a baby should not be permitted to suck its thumb, but many have yet to learn that a pacifier is also harmful to the welfare of a

child. A pacifier alters the shape of baby's mouth, helps cause adenoids and protruding teeth, as well as causing digestive trouble.

8. Not everybody takes communicable diseases who are exposed to them. The disease resistance agencies of the body may be able to conquer disease germs entering the system, and in this case, one escapes infection. One may also obtain immunity from certain diseases by vaccination and other methods.
