City Buys Water and Light Machinery.

The Miami City Council met Wednesday and Thursday of last week, received and opened bids and listened to the explanations and special benefits to be received from the material of about fifteen different bidders. The contracts were all let Thursday night and the various bidders left town.

The contract for two sixty horse power oil burning engines, delivered and installed was given to the Challege Co. of Dallas and two Muncy Engines. Delivery to be made in 40 days from date.

Contract for two General Electric 37 1/2 K. V. A. Generators to United Electric Company. Delivery to be made within 75 days from date.

Furnishing and installing the water mains let to Muller and Walker, Engin and Construction Co. To be completed in 120 days.

They purchased a Luitweler pump of 50 gallon capacity from Edge-Weave Co. of Dallas.

The contracts for the power-house, well, and reservoir was let, but will be contracted as soon as suitable bids are received.

Thus almost the entire outfit has been purchased and if not unforeseen things happens, we will likely have water and lights in Miami in the near future.

Auto Accident Fatal.

Pampa, Tex., Oct. 27.—Abrams Farrington, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Farrington, aged nineteen years, of this place was instantly killed this afternoon about 4 o'clock when the car he was driving overturned, pinning him beneath. Funeral services will be conducted here tomorrow afternoon.

Death was instant, the youths neck being broken when thrown to the ground, according to the estimate of those who viewed the remains. It seems evident that the boy was riding at a high rate of speed as the car skidded a considerable distance before overturning.

Only about six weeks ago Mr. Stockstill, a relative of the Farrington family, was killed in practically the same manner, thus giving a duplicate tragedy in the same locality within a short while.

The Farringtons have lived here during the past eight or ten years and the community is deeply affected by reason of the untimely death of the young man.

James Abram Farrington, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Farrington was born near Greenfield, Mo., Jan. 28, 1900, was killed in an auto accident Oct. 7, 1916, cause of the accident not known as he was driving alone. He leaves a father and mother, one brother and eight sisters to mourn his untimely death.

He was a good boy, exemplary in his habits, tender and loving to parents and members of the home, and religious from early childhood.

The family have many warm friends both at Miami and Pampa who deeply sympathize with them in their great sorrow, but can only commend them to God who has promised that all things shall work together for the good of them that love him.

Birth Rigration.

54,936 Births not registered. Some interesting facts are shown by the August Report of the Bureau of Vital Statistics. During August, 1916, 4470 births were recorded and more than 4578 were not registered, provided the birth rate of Texas is only 25 per 1000 per year.

If the labor unions, whose purpose is the protection of the laborer, both child and adult, were awake to the fact that the Child's Labor Law is absolutely dependent upon Birth Registration for enforcement, the Labor Unions in Texas would swing all their influence for complete Birth Registration.

If the tax payers realized how many cases are appealed to higher courts on a question of age and the cost of such cases to the State when such questions could be settled in the lower courts by a certified birth certificate, they would demand a complete Birth Registration.

Compulsory education without Birth Registration will lead to endless litigation, depriving the child of such education as the State intends to force upon it. Teachers who are progressive must stand for Birth Registration.

If the mothers realized that the orphan girl, who needs protection under those laws which have an age limit, it deprived of such protection by failure to have her birth registered, the mothers of Texas would see that every baby's birth in their community was registered.

Birth Registration keeps the under-age orphan boy out of the penitentiary or off of the galloons when his age would send him to the Reformatory.

Birth Registration will furnish the State unimpeachable evidence to convict the criminal who assaults an orphan girl under age of consent, and will exclude the purchaseable testimony of some negro woman, or an old Bible with its birth record that has been erased and rewritten.

The Minister of the Gospel, if he would be consistent, must stand for Birth Registration as a protection for those who will be orphans in coming generations.

Accuracy in Birth Registration is necessary. More than one of a hundred do not show the sex, date of birth, or if the child is legitimate or otherwise. If a child's birth is registered, the parent should not permit a stigma to be thrown on the child by questioning the legitimacy, unless it is otherwise. Such defects do not become apparent until the child's age is questioned, and it is possible that by that time it may be an orphan.

Watch for Bands of Wild Ducks

If you kill or capture a wild duck bearing an aluminum band around one leg, having a number on one side, and on the other a statement requesting the U. S. Department of Agriculture, or the Biological Survey, be notified, you are requested to send this band at once to the Bureau of Biological Survey, U. S. Department of Agriculture, Washington D. C. This band if accompanied by a statement as to date, place, and circumstances under which the bird was taken will be of service to the Survey in its efforts to determine the longevity of individual ducks and the routes of migration of the species. The bands are being attached to considerable numbers of wild ducks of several species which have been cured of the duck sickness prevalent around the Great Salt Lake, Utah, and there released. The Department is particularly anxious to secure reports from these birds to determine their complete recovery from this malady which has killed hundreds of thousands of ducks in Utah.
