'Lectric Light Sparks

The City Council was in regular session Monday night of this week. The usual run of bills were allowed. C. C. Carr qualified as the new alderman after the returns of the election were canvassed.

The Council purchased fixtures for the street lights. There will be four lights in the center of the crossing, one turned in each direction, and for the present they will have eight crossings lighted. One at each of the four churches, one at the railroad, one near Locke Garage and the other on the main crossing.

A representative of the electric company from whom they purchased most of the fixtures was here and promised to rush the shipment of the two generators and switch board.

The light poles were located again this week. They passed through Denver on the 10th, and since getting on the Santa Fe, we may expect them to arrive in about six days.

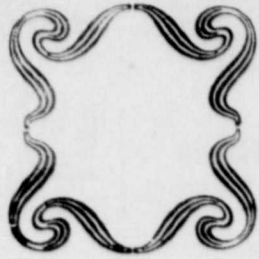

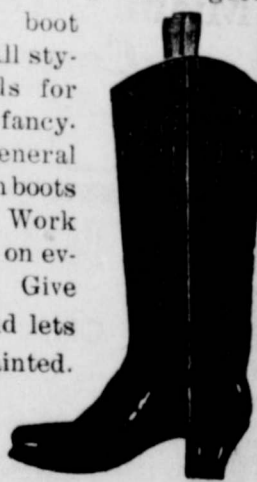
