CONDITIONS IN TEXAS

White Deer, Texas, June 11.—Crops generally in Texas are the best this season in many years, according to reports of correspondents from the Texas Industrial Commission during the past week. Timely rains, with intervals of good weather, during May, together with general rains during the first of June, have benefited all crops every section of the State, and supplied abundant subsoil mois-

Cotton
The crop has been reduced fully 10 per cent in acreage, and, except in portions of east Texas, is coming well, although from one to two weeks late. Boll-weevils are showing their appearance in central and northeast Texas at an earlier date than usual, which affords an opportunity for combatting them with arsenate, or, in cases where damage is serious enough, to pick up the crop and plant forage. Picking has begun in south Texas where there is some concern of a shortage of labor. Too much rain in east Texas has hindered the harvest. Drought conditions in Texas have been overcome by good rains.

Wheat and Oats.
Harvesting has begun in central and north Texas, and is moving toward the Panhandle. Conditions improved and the yield promises better than expected. In northwest Texas, particularly, conditions are excellent. Government estimates place acreage at 1,761,000 acres, with probable yield of 20,000,000 bushels. The oats crop in south and central Texas has fallen below nor-

Corn
The crop is in excellent condition throughout the entire State and a yield better than normal, from a greatly increased acreage, now appears prob-

Other Crops
The condition of the hay crop is the best that of last year with a yield expected to exceed 1,000,000 tons. Irish potato crop, from a largely increased acreage, will equal last year's yield of 220,000 barrels. Acreage of the crop is 50 per cent less than that of 1920.

Fruit and Truck
The Texas peach crop is estimated at 1,500,000 bushels, and shipments are already begun. Because of the size of this crop in other States, peach conditions are good. Pears and apples will make half a crop. Yields of all truck crops have been normal and prices generally have been satisfactory, but high freight rates have been adverse to the best marketing conditions. Tomatoes are moving in east Texas and prospects are favorable. The watermelon crop will be larger than usual. Melons should be plentiful in all markets of the State, as freight rates are against out-of-State shipments.

Livestock and Range
Livestock and range conditions are excellent, and cattle and sheep are in good flesh. With a greatly increased production of forage and feed there is every inducement for increasing the production of hogs and cattle, and "finishing" them in Texas preference to marketing them as stockers.

HARVEST OPENING THIS WEEK

The big Panhandle harvest is opening up this week, and by the middle of next week, machines will be in almost every field in this section of the country. This is a few days earlier than the usual harvest, possibly owing to the heavy rains.

Some of the farmers started binders Tuesday, and Wednesday, and some headers were put in the fields today, while the Combines will go to work about Monday of next week. About fifty of the header-threshers were sold new in this territory this year, and about the same number last year, and with the large number at work, a great amount of labor and time will be saved in harvesting this crop.

No correct estimate of the yield can be made for several days, but many of the farmers are expecting 20 to 25 bushels per acre, and some of the fields even promise more, while there are a few fields that will make much less.

CITY COUNCIL MET MONDAY

New Ordinance and Light Management Changed

The City Council met Monday of this week and among other business transacted was the passing of a City Ordinance requiring that mufflers must be on all motor vehicles and must be kept closed while running in the city limits.

City Light Plant Manager W. A. Dyer tentatively offered his resignation several weeks ago to become effective this summer. His resignation was accepted to become effective July 1st, and Mayor C. S. Seiber was placed in charge of the Light and Water service. J. B. Saul was appointed City Clerk also to become effective on that date.

City Marshall Wilson was also placed on the pay roll as night watchman for the next ninety days during the harvest season rush.

SETTING HARVEST PRICES

White Deer, Texas, June 14, 1921

Committees representing the Chambers of Commerce and the farmers from the towns of White Deer, Pampa and Panhandle met here yesterday for the purpose of discussing the proposition of wages for farm labor and to decide on some uniform scale for such labor. After thoroughly discussing the different phases of the subject, with fairness to both the farmer and laborer it was decided that \$2.50 per day and board would be a fair wage for common farm labor during this harvest. Other labor such as stackers, header men, and etc will be figured from this basis.

The secretary of the Chamber White Deer was requested to notify the farmers over this section of the country of said meeting and the action taken. The entire body wishes to advise the farmers not to pay more than the above mentioned as it means a loss to you. Bankers from different towns were present and in making their talks stated that the wage scale decided upon was to their belief right and just and that by helping the farmer would be helping himself.

DOWN IN OKLAHOMA
- 100 miles East of Texas Panhandle! Old Man Heare, waterbound! Think of it, marooned! Visiting kin folks, who live on a farm near Custer City. Thank goodness, they have plenty of good grub and dish it up royally. Customs differ here from our Texas habits.

The population is much greater to the square inch. North, South, East West and some other directions are represented here.

White people predominate. Black, Brown, Blue and Red people and mixed abound.

Poor Lo, who formerly was sole proprietor, now sits away back in the bend of the creek, surrounded by his "Gee String" and Blanket, while a full regiment of dogs make joyful noises to the "Great Spirit" around each Indian village. Since the melting rays of the sun follow the daily showers here, Old Man Heare has been planning to follow the example of the oldest inhabitants in methods of comfort.

He has ordered a cool "Gee String" for a summer garment.

Wheat is the chief crop in this locality. Corn, Kaffir, maize and millet are grown, but no cotton.

I saw more wagons and buggies in Custer City today, Saturday, than for many years. Also a great number of autos parked in the middle of the wide streets.

Three thousand dozen eggs sold in Custer City in one day, is a record to astonish a Texan. Cream cans adorn each wagon, buggy, auto and truck. The checks for cream, butter, eggs, and poultry paid out keeps the Wolves of Hunger away.

The crops are fairly good and with good prices for the products of these industrious people, prosperity would perch upon the door post of every "Ged Darned Farmer."

Turkeys, ducks, geese and chickens cover the premises around the farm houses.

The Lady whom we are visiting with uses frying sized chickens for stove wood.

Cream separators look you in the face on the screened-in porches, and suggest strawberries and cream.

Economy, thrift, honest toil are the passwords to plenty in Oklahoma.

The two weeks rainy spell, the washing out of bridges on railroads and neighborhood roads, the loss of life from floods, etc, has temporarily changed the channels of conversation here.

Democrats, Republicans, socialists, Bolsheviks, Americans (Indians) all agree that this has been the biggest, longest, muddiest, rainy spell since Oklahoma was taken from the Americans. Old Man and Old Lady Heare hope to get up on the Texas plains before another change of Administration.

IMPROVED ROADS

LARGER REVENUE FOR ROADS

Tendency Toward Devoting Increased Portion of Motor Vehicles Tax to Highways.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture) For a number of years the general tendency toward devoting an ever-increasing portion of the motor-vehicle revenues to road work under the control and direct supervision of the state highway departments has been very noticeable.

In most states the motor-vehicle revenues are devoted to maintenance and repair of the state roads or other improved highways. These states seem to have solved fairly well the difficult problem of securing funds for the maintenance of the more important roads under the ever-increasing traffic requirements.

A number of the states having in general but a small mileage of improved roads have recently adopted the plan of capitalizing the motor-vehicle revenues and devoting these funds to road construction.

At the beginning of 1921 there were still seven states in which motor trucks were registered at the same rate as passenger cars, but in recent years there has been a very decided tendency in most states to increase the fees required for motor trucks over and above those required for passenger cars.

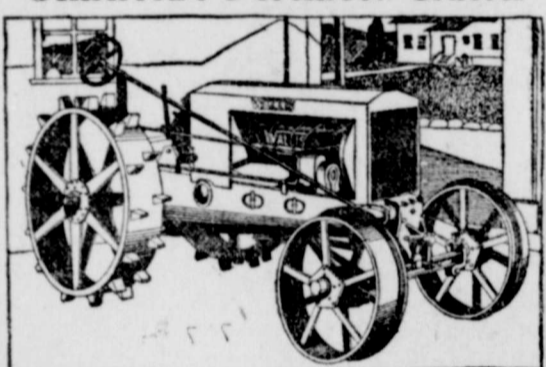

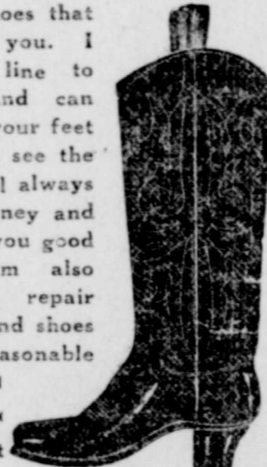
