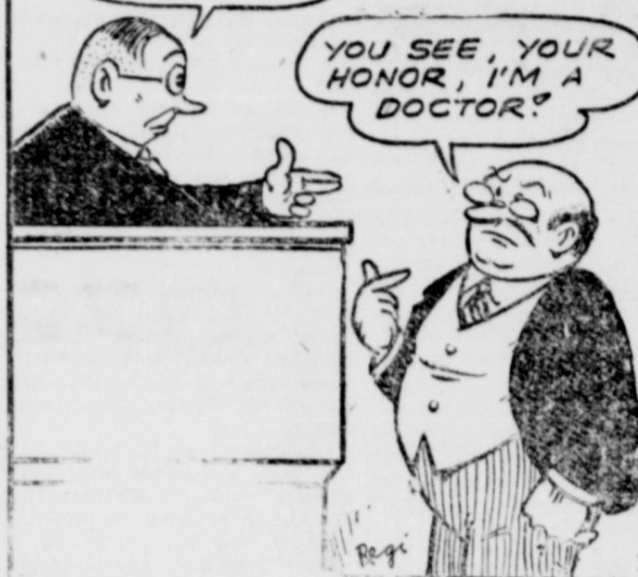

**Oilworkers Union Rebukes Government**

MEXICO CITY, March 17 (UP)—The powerful oil workers union has rebuked the government-controlled oil industry for granting American oil interests drilling rights in Mexico without consulting the union it was disclosed today.

But the union notified Petroleros Mexicanos (Pemex) that it would take no action on the move until it was determined whether the foreign interests respected "the sovereignty of Mexico and the interests of the workers."

The drilling agreement, reached a fortnight ago, gave a group headed by California oilman Edwin Pauley the right to conduct the first tidelands drilling operations in Mexican history.

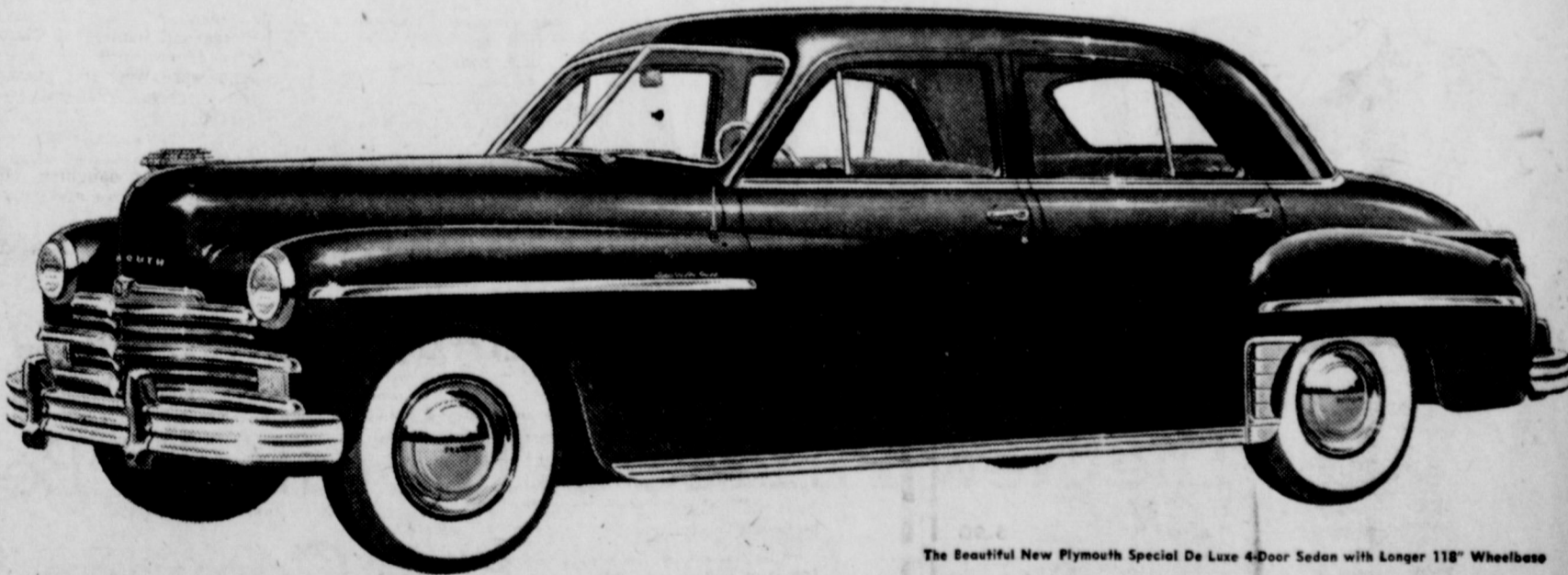

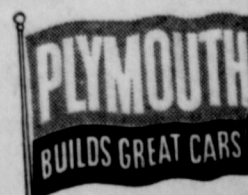

### TEXAS NEWS BRIEFS

**GLADEWATER, March 17 (UP)**—High school students will direct Gladewater's civil affairs on "youth day," March 25.

The day's activities will end "Democracy beats Communism week."

More than 95 per cent of the city's high school students went to their polls yesterday to elect Hughes Brown, campaigning for city betterment drives, mayor of "youth day." He plugged for a

change from mayor-commission to council-manager government.

**LUBBOCK, March 17 (UP)**—Johnny L. McGowan, 43, was electrocuted yesterday when he touched a 60,000-volt power line.

**DENTON, Tex. March 17 (UP)**

**DALLAS, March 17 (UP)**—Some 1,100 employees of the Magnolia Pipeline Company will find an eight-cent hourly "cost of living" bonus when an agreement reached by company and union officials goes into effect.

The bonus portion of the two-year "model" agreement will be renegotiated in December 1949, according to changes in the economic situation.

General pay increases ranging from one to six cents per hour also are included in eight states.

The union involved is the CIO international Oil Workers Union.

**ST. LOUIS, March 17 (UP)**—Wabash Railroad officials warned that they may be forced to start laying off 8,500 workers today unless 3,500 men who run the trains end their strike immediately.

**WASHINGTON, March 17 (UP)**—Stripped of its legalistic phrases, the new indictment of Judith Coplon, a justice department official said today, that she is charged with disclosing to the Russians

the names and activities of some American counter-spies.

Miss Coplon, a former employe in the department's foreign agents registration section, was arrested earlier this month with Valentine A. Gubitchev, Russian engineer on the United Nations staff. A New York grand jury last week indicted them for conspiracy to commit espionage.

The petite 27-year-old government employe was indicted again yesterday by a grand jury here, this time on straight espionage charges. Gubitchev was not named in this second indictment.

# Phone Earnings Hit Low Peak

ST. LOUIS, March 17.—The Southwestern Bell Telephone Company said in its annual report today that earnings fell to the lowest level in the utility's history.

The report said the level of earnings declined despite the company's greatest volume of business the company has ever handled and despite rate increases effective during part of the year in Oklahoma, Arkansas and Texas.

Rate of return on money invested in the telephone company in 1948 was 4.09 per cent, compared with 4.41 per cent in 1947.

year the utility reported a new low in earnings. Operating revenues totaled \$266,753,000, an increase of 20 per cent over 1947, while expenses went up 21 per cent to \$185,048,000, it said.

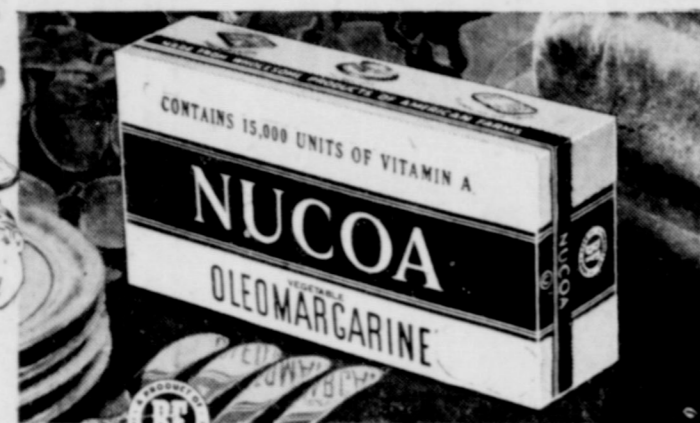
