Mexican Prison Escapees Evade Posse Of Police

MORELIA, Mexico, Aug. 3 (UP)—Fifty-eight dangerous criminals today slipped through a police cordon in the Santa Maria Hills five miles from this state capital and fled into the Michoacan Mountains, leaving eight prisoners and one policeman dead after a pitched battle between police and the fugitives.

Two groups of heavily-armed police pursued the 58 men, out of ammunition and armed only with knives and clubs, through the rough, heavily-wooded mountain country. The police carried tommy guns, rifles, pistols and knives.

The prisoners, survivors or a group of 74 which broke out of the Morelia Prison at 6 o'clock last night, ran out of ammunition at dawn today and broke through a cordon police and troops had thrown around the Santa Maria Hills.

Police said six prisoners were killed in the Santa Maria battle, two were killed in the initial break and eight had been captured. One jailer was killed in the break.

The prisoners seized eight Mauser rifles in the break and were also armed with knives and clubs. They dropped the rifles as they ran out of ammunition in the Santa Maria Hills.
