der the government's 1950 production control program.

Congressional sources said today that an effort to win congressional approval of some such protective measure probably will be made by some cotton belt congressman early in the next sesson before next year's crop planted.

This disclosure came after the agriculture department late yesterday published official 1950 planting allotments for each of the 20 producing states. The de-partment previously had set the national allotment at 21,000,000 (M) acres, a cutback of 20 per cent from this year's plantings an effort to hold down further surpluses.

In parceling out that national allotment the department called for state cutbacks averaging as high as 90 per cent in the case of Nevada, a minor producing state. Among the major producing states the allotments ranged from a cut averaging 47 per cent in New Mexico to a boost averaging four per cent in Oklahoma.
