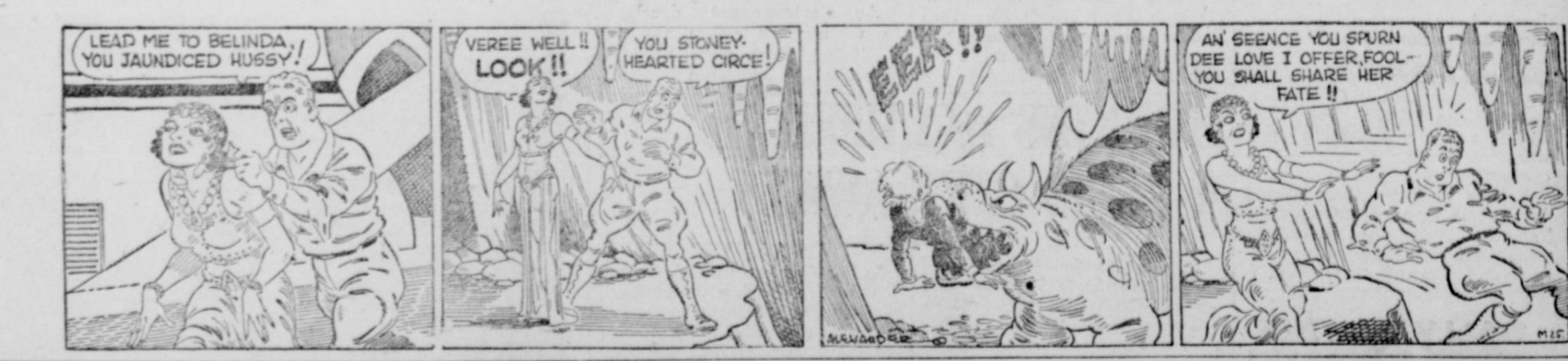

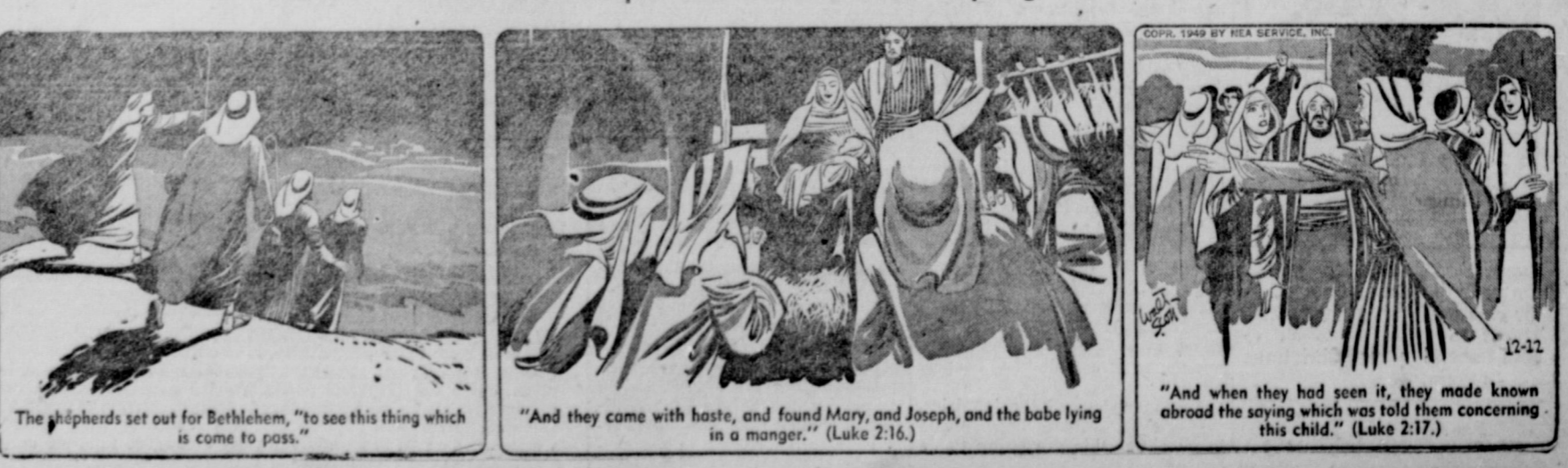

CLAIMS MURDER PART OF SUICIDE AGREEMENT

EVANSVILLE, Ind., Dec. 5 (UP) — A 22-year-old Bespectacled College student claims today that he killed his beautiful 16-year-old sweetheart with a hammer in a suicide pact at her request but failed to take his own life when his "last nerve cracked."

Franklin Thomas Slay, Griffin, Ind., sat in his jail cell here and read detective story magazines after confessing to the hammer slaying of Mary Ellen Harmon, Nov. 26 near Hopkinsville, Ky., about 90 miles south of here.

He said he backed down on his half of the suicide pact when he lost his nerve as he stood on a nearby bridge, poised to leap.

An autopsy on the girl's body was scheduled for today. Slay told reporters the girl was pregnant. In his confession, the slender, studious-looking youth said he called for Miss Harmon at her home here after the Thanksgiving holiday, planning to drive together

to Florida where he was a student at the University of Florida. "We were fully agreed on marriage," he said in the confession. As they drove, "Mary was very silent. I asked her if something was wrong."

"She replied, Frank, this is wrong and if we do it, it won't be right the first wrong."

She said she was conscience-stricken because they had lived together as man and wife. "I asked her what she wanted to do," he said. "She said, 'Let's die in each other's arms.'"

"I was shocked and I asked if she was sure and she said 'yes.'"

"I drove up into a side road. After we professed our love we agreed on my shooting her and then myself."

The youth said he took out his .22 rifle but when a "piece of the gun" fell off, "we found another way."

"I remember taking a hammer from the tool chest in the car and telling her to bend over," he said.

"She did so and I struck her head—I don't know how many times."

Two Chases Get Wanted Men

DALLAS, Tex., Dec. 5 (UP) — Dallas County officers stepped on the gas early today in two separate chases to arrest two men wanted for a \$400 robbery in Corsicana and a lone motorist driving a stolen car.

Four hours after a Cabell's Dairy store was held up in Corsicana, 50 miles south of here, two Dallas patrolmen sighted a bullet-spattered 1950 Studebaker described as the getaway car.

Officers E. J. Coulon and H. L. Thomas started in pursuit at the northeastern edge of Dallas, chasing the auto nearly 11 miles to Garland. Several shots fired into the rear of the new car finally brought it to a halt.

The occupants surrendered without exchanging gunfire.

They were booked as Robert Leeman, 22, and James Thomas Scribner, 21, both of Bonham.

Coulon said he found two boxes of ammunition on the front seat of their car. Both men were armed. Leeman's coat lapel was pierced by a bullet and slight bullet wound marked his chest.

Corsicana officers earlier had reported wounding one of the men while spraying their car with bullets during a running gun battle in Navarro County.

A sum of \$400 was found in the men's possession.

While local police were alerted for Corsicana holdup pair, a Cockrell Hill, Dallas County, officer engaged in a 30-mile chase with a suspected auto thief. The man was captured and jailed.

BOY SHOT BY RAPIST IN CRITICAL CONDITION

ORANGE, Tex., Dec. 5 (UP) — An Orange high school student shot in stomach by a young man who raped a 16-year-old girl and left another couple bound in a rice field, remained critically wounded early today as police hunted the armed assailant.

John Hulsope, 17, was shot when he resisted the khaki-clad attacker who surprised the two couples parked on a quiet country road Saturday night.

Hulsope's companions, all fellow-students, were treated for exposure after spending part of the

night and helpless in a muddy field.

After firing two wild shots and shooting Hulsope, the man described as about 20, got into the car and forced 17-year-old Ikie Bullock to drive. Bullock, unfamiliar with driving an auto, ran the car into a ditch after traveling a half mile.

The gunman ordered the teenagers to walk a quarter of a mile to a rice field. There, the girls were forced to bind their dates with belts and shotlaces.

When the man threatened to "kill all of you," Hulsope pleaded for the attacker to kill only him and spare his friends.

The boys were left behind as the man walked the girls to another

negro couple who have worked for Barkley for 27 years.

The "Veep" asked reporters and photographers not to follow.

"We'd love to have you come out some time later. But not tonight," he said.

Waiting at the station for the Barkley was Wilbur Walker, the negro chauffeur who drives for the Vice President.

"Congratulations," he greeted Mrs. Barkley.

"Congratulations to you. You're a bridegroom, too," she replied.

The couple will go to Florida this week where the Vice President will speak to the American Coffee Association at Boca Raton.

Barkley said they do not plan to visit President Truman at Key West.

The Barkleys will return to Washington next Saturday so the Veep can attend the Gridiron Dinner. Then they will return to their Sea Island, Ga., honeymoon "Shangri-La."

Two hours later, Hulsope chewed through the shotlaces binding his wrists, freed Bullock and began a fruitless search for the girls. A motorist drove them to Orange to notify authorities. Police found the bound 17-year-old girl about dawn yesterday. She led officers to the other girl.

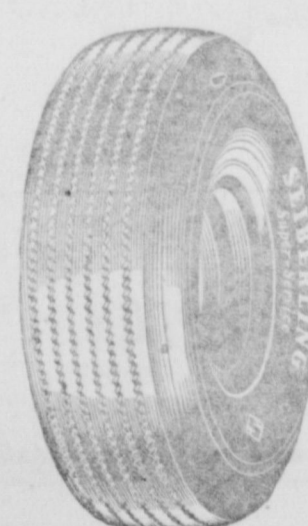
