



### Hedy Lamarr Property Is Sold At Public Auction In Hollywood

HOLLYWOOD, July 9 (UP)—Some of actress Hedy Lamarr's "falsies" became the property today of a pretty brunette.

Slee-eyed Ann See prodded her husband, Charlie, a Hollywood photographer, into bidding \$13 for the gay deceivers.

A strapless black chiffon cocktail dress went along with the sale, too. The "falsies" were built into it.

"I got a real bargain," Mrs. See grinned.

So did a lot of other women as dozens of the actress' fabulous furs and expensive evening gowns were knocked down for a fraction of their cost at an auction of the actress' personal property.

A \$300 Christian Dior creation went for \$50, a \$300 sapphire original for \$22, and a \$500 royal purple and ruby red velvet gown for \$70.

But the unhappiest lady in the crowd was blonde dress designer Eloise Jensen, who counted Hedy as one of her best customers. Miss Jensen's pretty face was contorted as she watched her \$300 creations go for \$25 and a \$395 powder blue chiffon for \$50.

"It makes me sick," she said, "What's the use."

Mrs. Jay Barney Crdin, wife of a Los Angeles pottery manufacturer, snapped up Hedy's \$3,000 white mink, stole for \$1,750, a \$5,000 mink coat for \$2,300 and an \$1,800 platinum fox cape for \$225.

Most energetic bidder in auctioneer Arthur B. Goode's jammed gallery was Aaron Kaye a gray-haired owner of the Ritz Thrift Shop on Tuth Street in New York.

"I came all the way out here just to buy those things," he said, "I wanted everything, but these foolish women bid too high."

Kaye got Hedy's \$6,000 mink coat for \$2,200, her \$1,500 beaver coat for \$500, her \$1,200 ocelot for \$250, and her \$1,500 Russian Lynx jacket for \$150.

### U. S. BUILDING DEFENSES FROM AZORES AIR BASE

TERCEIRA ISLAND, Azores (UP)—This tiny Portuguese island, which for centuries thrived on its fishing and its vineyards, has become one of the key bases in the Atlantic Pact plan for the defense of Europe.

Terceira's importance is largely an accident of geography. It is two-thirds of the way across the Atlantic from North American air bases in Europe. Its importance is growing daily.

Heavily laden cargo planes of the U. S. Military Air Transport system take off from American bases for Europe. Because they can land here and refuel, their gas loads are lighter and their pay loads are heavier.

Old Customs Linger

Terceira still depends on its ancient customs for a livelihood and the fishing boats still put out from the villages. Farmers till the fields and the vineyards on the volcanic slopes from which a few wisps of sulphuric gas still issue.

### Truck Driver Has Wild Ride

WURTSBORO, N. Y., July 9 (UP)—The driver of a runaway trailer truck loaded with inflammables was called into court today to describe his wild ride a mile and a half down a winding Catskill Mountain road smashing into 12 automobiles, killing four persons and injuring 20.

Marion Reese, 28, Newark, N. J., said his air brakes failed yesterday and he tried to sidetrack the

trailer truck into a guard rail when he saw the automobiles at the foot of the mountain waiting at a stop light.

He told State Troopers he honked his horn frantically, but side-swiped several automobiles approaching him before smashing into a taxicab in which three persons were killed. The driver of one of the cars also was killed.

Reese was arraigned before Magistrate J. Eugene O'Gorman on a criminal negligence charge and held in \$5,000 bail.

The propane gas Reese was hauling in the trailer did not explode but the impact of his truck and the taxicab ignited the truck's gasoline.

### EIGHT TIE SELVES UP

DEALE, MD. July 9 (UP)—Four young women and four youths, who tied themselves together and swam for hours in Choptank Bay waters after their cabin cruiser broke up were rescued today.

A ninth survivor, Philip Klosky, 23, of Washington, D. C., touched off the wide search for the other eight last night by swimming almost two and a half miles to the shore and giving the alarm.

Although exhausted, the youth refused medical aid and jumped into a boat to help in the search. His fiancée, Rita McDonald of Washington, D. C., was among the eight out in the white-capped waters.

"I've got to get out there, I've got to get out there," Klosky told those who tried to detain him.

Miss McDonald credited her fiancée and Victor Fortwengler, both former Navy sailors, for their "cool-headed" instructions when the cruiser began breaking up for saving their lives.

"The girls were put over the side first with life preservers and the boys handed us a tow line," Miss McDonald said. "Then they came over the side. We all clung to the tow line.

"When we began drifting fast

with the tide, Philip decided to swim to shore and get help."

The eight apparently had been in the water for about three hours while a Coast Guard flying boat dropped flares and many small boats scoured the area off West River, Md.

The eight, all of the Washington area, included Mr. and Mrs. Victor Fortwengler of Arlington, Va.

What started as a Sunday pleasure cruise and almost ended in disaster began yesterday morning when the nine young persons left Washington and drove to Deale for a trip aboard the 32-foot Kathleen V.

Wind freshened on Chesapeake Bay in the afternoon and the waves rose.

"A board seemed to have been ripped loose by one particularly high wave," Klosky reported. Then four more waves smashed it and the boat just seemed to break up.

"However, all of us got life preservers on. The other eight tied themselves together, and I swam for shore."

The Methodist pastors of the Cisco District are to meet at Gorman Monday morning July 16 to perfect plans for the district's participation in the Texas-wide Methodist United Evangelistic Campaign in October and Nov. according to announcement of the Rev. Leslie W. Seymour, district superintendent. The Rev. Garland Lavender, pastor of the Ranger Methodist Church, is the district director of evangelism.

The closing feature of the week will likewise be a mass meeting of the entire district on the last Sunday of the week. This will be at Cisco for this district. All the pastors and visiting preachers in each district will meet daily for worship, planning, instruction and the noon meal together.

Bishop Wm. C. Martin of Dallas and Bishop A. Frank Smith of Houston, are in general charge of the program.

## Sabrejets Shoot Down Russian Jet

**8TH ARMY HEADQUARTERS** July 9 (UP) — U. S. Sabrejets shot down one Russian-built jet today in the third straight day of aerial combat over North Korea.

Allied warplanes resumed their attacks on the Red supply route north of "Neutral" Kaesong in the lull between Sunday's preliminary cease-fire talks there and the start of the formal armistice conference tomorrow.

On the ground, United Nations fighting men launched hard-hit-

ting but small attacks described as "limited offensives". The Communists struck back with battalion-sized assaults at U.N. troops who won control of high ground.

Allied planes were in the air around the clock. Soviet-built MIG-15's who lost three planes to U. S. fighters Sunday, came
