15 rabbits to his credit.
Not wanting to be cutdone in any trivial matters the Noodle delegation called a meeting for the next day snd under the direction of Walter Witt of that place killed 325 rablits. During this drive Walter Greene made high score with 30 long ears to his oredit. Only shot guns with small shot were used.

At the time the Merkel men started from home at 3 o'clock 170 rabbits had been killed and the men from that section of the oountry were still slaying them at that hour.
