said that it mattered not whether Mr. McClure or H. B. Terrel was elected they would have a friend in court. Charges were made then preferred
with the prohibitibition advisory committee against Mr. McClure. They were investigated and a demand was made upon Mr. McClure to withdraw. He told one of the Toms that he would sithdraw, accordong to the political gossip, but when he got to Fort Worth to confer with another Tom, Tom Simmons, his kinsman, Tom McClure, and Tom Simmons agreed to notify a Dallas Tom that there was a mistake-he would not withdraw. And Mr. McClure answered for publication that he is
