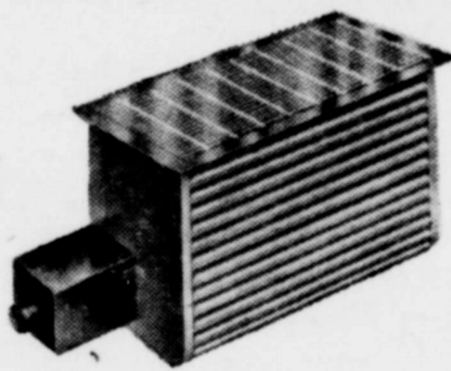

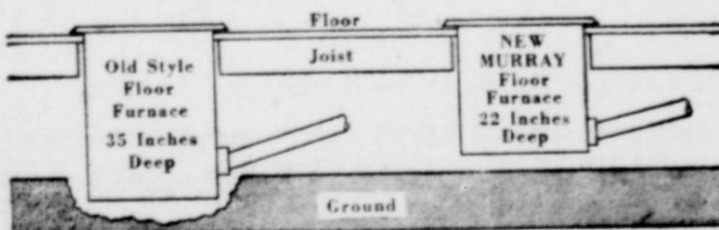

Five conservation group meetings were held last week in the Merkel area of the Middle Clear Fork Soil Conservation district, for these groups: Gelan, Sinclair, Comere, Boyd's Chapel and Carpenter's Gap. Technicians from the Soil Conservation service assisted the group leaders in conducting these meetings. Winter cover crops and other time-ly conservation measures were the central theme of this series of meetings, where films stressing two soil conservation practices were shown.

This is an opportune time to lay plans for fall and winter cover crops. Most district cooperators who grew winter cover crops last year were impressed and well pleased with the results obtained from winter cover crops in protecting their soil against wind erosion and for grazing. Dry weather prevented most legumes from making a seed crop last year; however, they served a very useful purpose in controlling wind blowing of top soil. Most legumes seed which are adapted locally can be purchased from local seed dealers.

Information, based on field trials from former experience in the Merkel area over the past three years, as contained in the following summary, may be useful in selecting a legume for your farm. Good to excellent results have been obtained by farmers using these legumes on the soil types as shown in the following prepared table, giving type of soil first, adapted legume, planting rate per acre, method of planting and time of planting:

Tight land: Madrid sweet clover, 2 to 3 lbs., rows, Nov., Feb. and

March; Hubam sweet clover, 4 to 6 lbs., rows, Feb. and March; winter peas, 10 to 12 lbs., rows, Sept. and Oct., 20 to 25 lbs., drilled, Sept. and Oct.

Mixed sandy loam soils: Madrid sweet clover, 2 to 3 lbs., rows, Nov., Feb. and March; Hubam sweet clover, 4 to 6 lbs., rows, Feb. and March; winter peas, 10 to 12 lbs., rows, Sept. and Oct., 20 to 25 lbs., drilled, Sept. and Oct.; Hairy vetch and rye, 19 lbs. vetch, 20 to 30 lbs. rye, drilled, Sept. and Oct.

Deep sands: Hairy vetch and rye, 10 lbs. vetch, 20 to 30 lbs. rye, drilled, Sept. and Oct.; winter peas, 20 to 25 lbs., drilled, Sept. and Oct.

Bottom land soils: Alfalfa, 10 to 12 lbs., drilled, Sept. and Oct.; Madrid sweet clover, 2 to 3 lbs., rows, Nov., Feb. and March.

**Electric Industry Has

Abilene, Sept. 30.—The 40-millionth customer of the electric industry came on the power line sometime between Sept. 8 and Sept. 15. Ernest R. Acker, president of the Edison Electric Institute, has advised Price Campbell, president of the West Texas Utilities company.

Pointing out that the demand for electric service in West Texas for cooking, cooling, water heating, lighting and many additional uses in industries and stores is at an all time high, Mr. Campbell said:

"In keeping with its policy of anticipating future need, the West Texas Utilities company is now engaged in an \$18,000,000 construction program to build new facilities and to enlarge and improve existing ones. Much of the material for this program, which has been under way for many months, was ordered as early as September, 1946."

Five conservation group meetings were held last week in the Merkel area of the Middle Clear Fork Soil Conservation district, for these groups: Golan, Sinclair, Compere, Boyd's Chapel and Carpenter's Gap. Technicians from the Soil Conservation service assisted the group leaders in conducting these meetings. Winter cover crops and other timely conservation measures were the central theme of this series of meetings, where films stressing two soil conservation practices were shown.

This is an opportune time to lay plans for fall and winter cover crops. Most district cooperators who grew winter cover crops last year were impressed and well pleased with the results obtained from winter cover crops in protecting their soil against wind erosion and for grazing. Dry weather prevented most legumes from making a seed crop last year; however, they served a very useful purpose in controlling wind blowing of top soil. Most legumes seed which are adapted locally can be purchased from local seed dealers.

Information, based on field trials from former experience in the Merkel area over the past three years, as contained in the following summary, may be useful in selecting a legume for your farm. Good to excellent results have been obtained by farmers using these legumes on the soil types as shown in the following prepared table, giving type of soil first, adapted legume, planting rate per acre, method of planting and time of planting:

Tight land: Madrid sweet clover, 2 to 3 lbs., rows, Nov., Feb. and

March; Hubam sweet clover, 4 to 6 lbs., rows, Feb. and March; winter peas, 10 to 12 lbs., rows, Sept. and Oct., 20 to 25 lbs., drilled, Sept. and Oct.

Mixed sandy loam soils: Madrid sweet clover, 2 to 3 lbs., rows, Nov., Feb. and March; Hubam sweet clover, 4 to 6 lbs., rows, Feb. and March; winter peas, 10 to 12 lbs., rows, Sept. and Oct., 20 to 25 lbs., drilled, Sept. and Oct.; Hairy vetch and rye, 10 lbs. vetch, 20 to 30 lbs. rye, drilled, Sept. and Oct.

Deep sands: Hairy vetch and rye, 10 lbs. vetch, 20 to 30 lbs. rye, drilled, Sept. and Oct.; winter peas, 20 to 25 lbs., drilled, Sept. and Oct.

Bottom land soils: Alfalfa, 10 to 12 lbs., drilled, Sept. and Oct.; Madrid sweet clover, 2 to 3 lbs., rows, Nov., Feb. and March.
