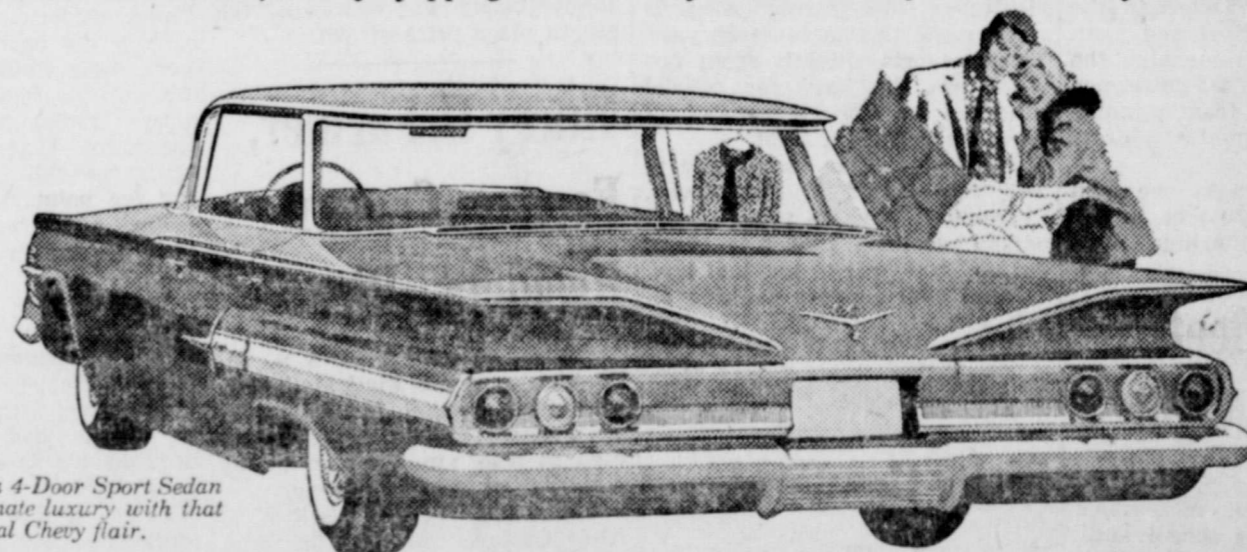

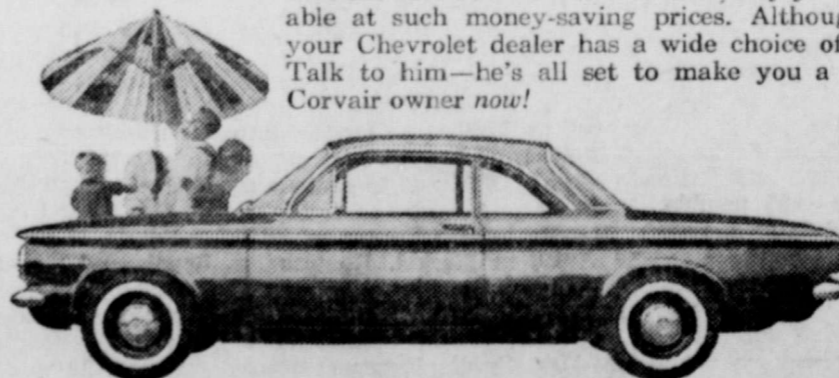

# Garden Tips

By The Merkel Garden Club  
Two things we should all do if we would have more success with our vegetables, flowers, shrubs and trees.

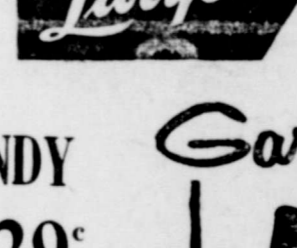

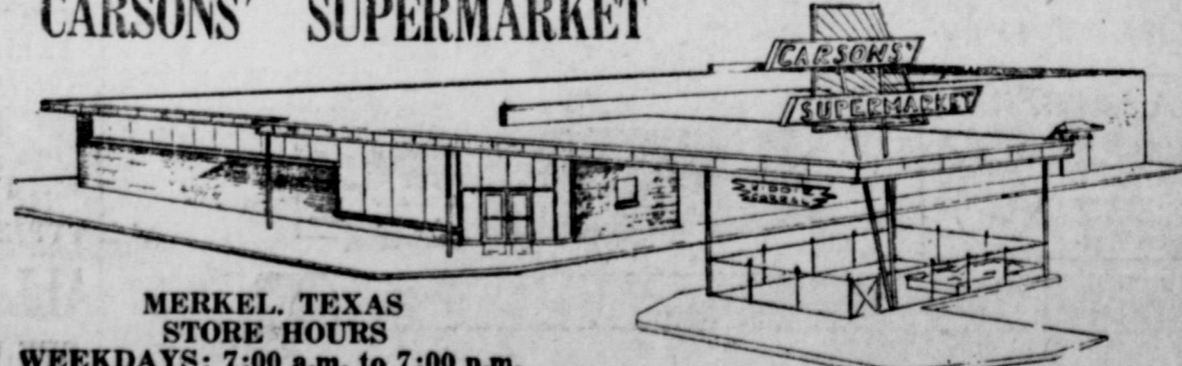
