

Boys win district track title; girls qualify two two in track, golf team

The Merkel High school boys track lost a couple of track meets this team defended their district championship in the district SAAA track meet Friday in Sonora. The boys captured the title by 11 points over Wylie. The boys racked up a

total of 1355 points. Seniors Brit Pursley and Shayne Newberry led the way as they scored 89 of the points.

Pursley led the way as he racked up 48 points. He was 2nd in the pole vault and won the long jump, high jump, 100 meter and ran the states' best 110 hurdle race this season as he blazed to a time of 13.53 to set a new school record.

It was the first time Pursley had broken 14 second in that race and it is the fastest 110 hurdle time in the state this year, regaridess of school size.

Newberry won the discus and the 300 intermediate hurdles and was 2nd in the long jump and the 110




