Any middle school or high school student can sign up in Mr. Broeker's office at the school.





#### Hereford Red Cross Chapter Accepting Kosovo Donations

The Tri-County Chapter of the American Red Cross is located in Hereford. They will be assisting all American Red Cross chapters with donations toward the relief effort for the Kosovo refugees.

Officials estimate that the American Red Cross will need \$1 million a week for the next few months to meet the emergency humanitarian needs. Americans have already contributed more than \$1.5 million for the relief operation.

They will be acquiring warehouse space, forklifts, vehicles, and relief supplies for use in Macedonia and Albania. Some of the funding will be used in Bulgaria to purchase blankets, food and other relief supplies as well as the transportation necessary to get that relief to Macedonia.

Cash donations to the American Red Cross are the best way to help victims of this conflict and allow for the most immediate use of resources.





Near as I can figure that gives me somewhere between 50 and 60 choices of viewing pleasure now.

The four new and exciting channels they gave me (at no extra charge yet) include: The Golf Channel, 24-hours of golf stuff; ZDTV, which is a 24hour channel about computers; Telemundo, a spanish-speaking channel; and MSNBC, which appears to be 24-hours a day of commercials, interrupted only by a few minutes of live

The addition of MSNBC now gives me three NBC channels, NBC, CNBC, & MSNBC.




