

SIX FROM CLYDE MAKE REGION BAND; SIX MAKE AREA

CLYDE — Seven students from Clyde tried for positions in the All-Region band and six were not only placed in the band but were placed high enough to be certified for All-Area band in Austin in January.

Even though 18 from Clyde made All-District band, only seven of them tried for All-Region because deadline for tryouts were before district tryouts. Because North district tryouts were so late, the South district placed about 75 percent of the band at All-Region, including 22 placed by Lampasas and 20 placed by Brady.

Clyde placed the 3rd largest number going to area behind these two large South district schools. Brady had 10 to area and Lampasas had 8 to area. Clyde had 6 to area. No other school had more than two certified for area except Winters which had three. A total of 48 people from our 38 school region were certified to area.

Those making the All-Region and All-Area bands were Tommy Cooper on bass, a senior; Melinda Bynum, first chair contra-bass clarinet, a junior;

Tommy Fox, 2nd chair trumpet, a sophomore; Jeri Pruet, 4th chair French horn, a sophomore; Francis Bodine, 5th chair flute, a sophomore; and DeNeil Estes, 1st chair cornet, a sophomore.

Jo Ann Davis was the other person trying for a place in the All-Area band, who was not placed. Even though he was not selected, the Clyde band members were very proud of her for trying and putting forth the effort and also congratulating her for being selected to the All-District band earlier.

It is hoped by the band and Clyde band boosters that the six students who go to area in January will not let up and will practice enough to be selected to All-State, to be held in February in Ft. Worth.

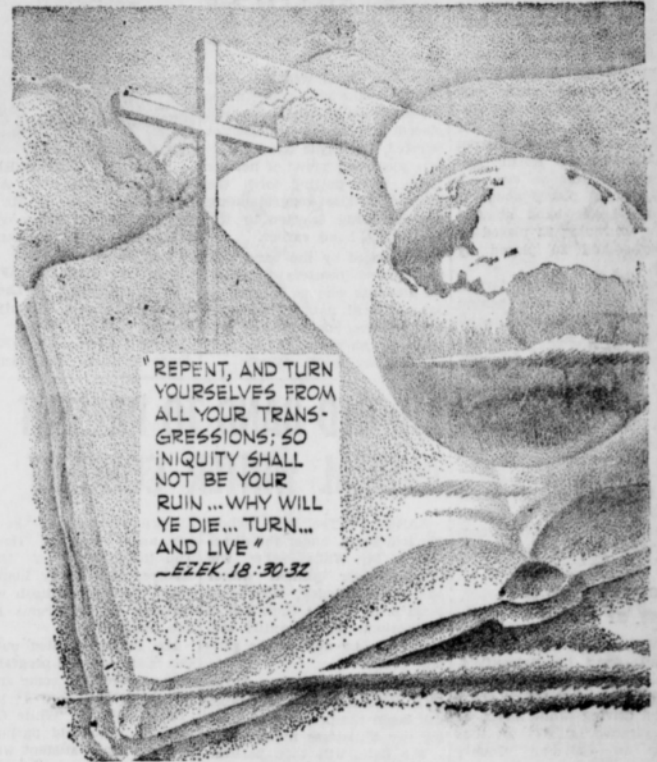

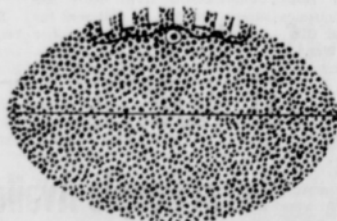

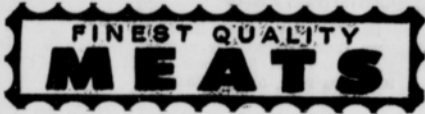
