Jack Boone Announces Candidacy For District Attorney

Jack Boone, an attorney in Memphis is announcing his candidacy for the office of District Attorney for the 100th Judicial District. The District includes the counties of Childress, Hall, Collingsworth, Donley and Carson.

Mr Boone has been serving as Justice of the Peace in Memphis, but will resign from that office to run for District Attorney.

He is a life long resident of Memphis. He attended the University of Texas for seven years from which he received his Bachelor of Arts and Law degrees. He has been practicing law in Memphis since September 1965.

In professional affairs, Mr. Boone is a member of the American Judicature Society and the State Bar of Texas. He has served as President of this Judicial Bar Association. Last year the President of the State Bar appointed him to the important committee on Administration of Justice. This group, composed of lawyers and judges, meets several times a year in Austin, where all changes in court procedures are formulated. He is also a member of Phi Alpha Delta legal fraternity.

In civic affairs, Mr Boone is a Director of the Memphis Chamber of Commerce, Director and Secretary of the Memphis Country Club, and a member of the Lions Club.

In military affairs, he is a Captain in the Marine Corps Reserve. Before entering Law School, he served three years on active duty, most of which was served in Okinawa, Vietnam, and Laos.

He and his family are members of the First Baptist Church of Memphis. His wife is the former Bebe Moody of Houston, and they have two children, Kathy and Marshall.

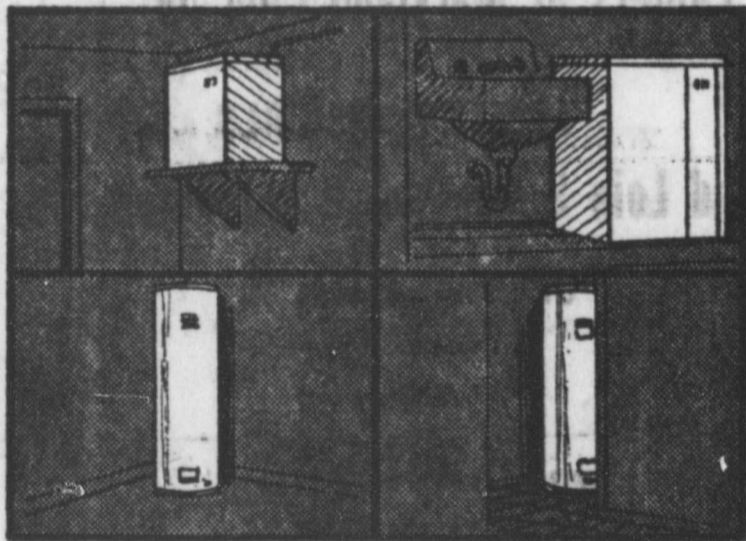

Drivers License

Austin—Col. Homer Garrison Jr., director of the Texas Department of Public Safety reminded Texans today that a color photograph becomes a standard part of all drivers' licenses issued after Jan. 1, 1968.

"The change makes it necessary for all drivers to renew licenses in person at one of our Department offices," Garrison said, "and we have been working toward setting up a procedure that will not cause excessive delay when a person comes to us to renew a license."

Garrison explained that the change in license was incorporated into law by the last legislature.

"Renewal notices will be mailed to each driver, just as always," Garrison said. "However, under the new procedure, each driver must take the renewal notice to the nearest DPS office. There he will be given a standard vision test, sign the renewal notice and step in front of our camera. The picture will be snapped and a receipt will be issued to enable the person to drive until he receives his new license in the mail."

Garrison explained that about 250 full time license offices would be in operation over the state to service license renewals.
