

AUSTIN — Most homeowners are expected to get a big break on insurance rates next year.

Exceptions will be those who live in the 27-county Gulf Coast area.

The industry-oriented Texas Insurance Advisory Association recommended the State Board of Insurance reduce by 17.7 per cent extended coverage (hall, windstorm, vandalism, etc.) rates and by 16.2 per cent homeowners' rates in the North-Northwest area, That includes most of the Panhandle and

rates and by 182 per cent homeowners' rates in the NorthNorth-west area, That includes most of the Panhandle and South Plains.

Association recommendations for the big Central Inland territory (Dallas, Ft. Worth, San Antonio, El Paso, Austin areas) included a 12.1 per cent decrease in extended coverage and 10.9 per cent reduction in homeowners' premiums.
